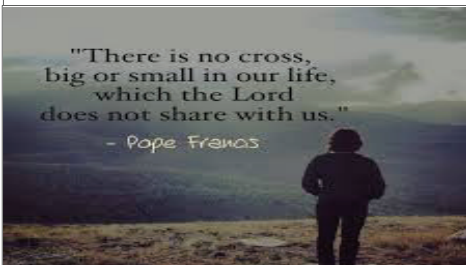

## Ruminations...

It seems that summer has been a long time in coming. This has been good news for the Spring Gardens. The tulips lasted much longer, and the pansies have been flourishing. Usually once a hot day comes, these wilt in the heat, but even though it is time to transition the flower pots to a summer wardrobe, the Spring pots are still healthy and vibrant. It just seemed counter intuitive to be digging out these plants, especially since it was a cold and rainy Thursday afternoon and evening. It was a night of layers of warm clothes and waterproof rainwear. The driving rain was off and on with glimpses of sun and the occasional rainbow which lifted the spirits somewhat. It was a miserable day to contend with planting summer beauty. Fortunately many hands make light work and lots of people joined us in the rain which made the work go a lot faster. There were old people and not so old people and young people. In my mind I fit into the latter category so when it came time for heavy lifting and moving awkward items, (which has always been my strong suit) naturally I would step up. To my shock and chagrin, some of the not so old people and young people had the audacity to suggest that I shouldn't be doing the heavy work. Well, being the competitive sort, that just strengthened my obstinacy and resolve and I was flinging soil and hauling trees and lugging rocks alongside them youngin's. After all, as I wanted to prove, 57 is the new thirty, well, maybe forty. As I stalwartly pulled my weight my thoughts turned to how my dad, because of a heart condition, would never have been able to keep up with me. This heavy manual labour would have been his death. Then I thought of all the funerals I have presided over during almost three decades of priesthood, of 'young' people who had died playing hockey or cutting grass or running marathons, all in much better shape than me. It was a bit unnerving, but exhilarating at the same time. Now I would not have wanted "he died planting flowers" on my tombstone. I am sure there are better ways to go, and so when I think of that final message engraved on that monument, I have higher expectations for something more meaningful on mine. Even with the many hands and strong backs that endured the rain and cold to beautify our property, it still took a solid three hours and so at the end, I was cold and damp and admittedly sore. I plopped down on the couch too beat to eat, so I just sat there watching nothing, thinking of nothing, totally zoned out. Finally I got the gumption to get up and get moving, at least my mind thought about doing that, but my 57 year old body that I presumed was the new forty

didn't really agree. So amidst some moans and groans and twists and turns, I managed to stagger to my feet thinking that my mind is saying 57 is the new forty, but my body is saying that 57 is the new seventy. I wish someone would make up their mind, and thank God there were some young people for whom 20 is the new 20. *Fr. Roy*
