#### **Ruminations...**

In terms of the Leary clan, Mothers' Day was the big event of the Spring. That was the day when everyone's birthday was celebrated in one huge swoop. It was cake with little thimble sized champagne glasses stuck in the cake for the big Mothers' Day/ Birthday Toast. Fathers' Day by comparison was a non-entity. Perhaps that is a by-product of a matriarchal grand aunt, or a farm house devoid of any fathers. I don't think anyone really minded the understated day. Going out to the farm always meant that we had to be on our best behaviour, minding our p's and q's, which took an exorbitant amount of energy, and these old spinster grand aunts who had been teachers all their lives, had little time for the rough and tumble antics that could and would happen. I think what was appealing about Fathers' Day for my dad was that it was usually peony season. Peonies were his favorite flower. Out on the farm, there was various stands of peonies that had been growing for generations. Now when dad was getting some of the plants for our own home from those legacy gardens, the old farmer aunts had precise rules about when they could be dug up and transplanted. They could only be dug up around the full moon closest to August 15. Never really understood it, but if we were going to have our share of the family peonies, dad had to abide. So when the moon was full on an August day, we went with shovels and bushel baskets in hand to dig up some plants that had been part of the showy stand of peonies for over 75 years at the time. Now back in Holland Landing, waters and sewers had been installed making our delicious artesian well run dry, but better, our septic system obsolete. There was always a particular part of the back yard where grass was noticeably greener for some reason, and it seemed that the best place to transplant the peonies. Over the years they have flourished and generously blossomed. Though peonies are nowhere near my favorite, I do have a special appreciation for them as they connect me to dad, but also to the lineage of Irish farmers in the Gormley area. So I purchased some for the front gardens here at the Church. Though one plant was lost to the winter, the others seem to be doing great and are ready to explode into those heavy stooping blooms. I added two new ones last year.



I particularly liked a pale yellow one, and it wasn't until I had planted it and was reviewing the bill that I discovered that it was about four times as much as the other one. Anyway, I was glad to see that it has survived the winter and is set to produce its flower. I

hope it is worth the exorbitant cost and has a long lie in our garden.  $\mathcal{F}_{r.} \mathcal{R}_{oy}$
