#### **Ruminations** ....

It is a dreary, rainy, dark Thursday morning and I am almost two days late in preparing this article. Part of the delay is rooted in the very unexciting life, one might say boring, that is augmented by the remnants of the pandemic. It is kind of hard making grocery shopping, or weeding the gardens sound remotely interesting, though I did have a surprise. I had planted green bean seeds that were at least three years old. I wasn't sure if they would germinate. The package said it would take seven to fourteen days for them to sprout. Well after the two weeks, there wasn't even a hint of green pushing through the soil. I had resolved that the next time I was out, I would pick up some new seeds. A couple of days later I saw a sprout, that distinctive leaf formation that could only be a bean plant. It was mildly exciting but the rest seemed dead. It was a couple of days later again when I had some errands to run so I checked over the garden and low and behold, there were three quarters of the row up and doing fine. Instead of fourteen days, it took twenty-one days. Patience, patience, patience. I think this odd spring weather has thrown off so many plants. I was awaiting the development of my rows and rows of potatoes, and they too were uncharacteristically delays. I am happy to say they are all up and looking great. In a couple of months, I will be eating the best mash potatoes, and hash browns this side of Prince Edward Island, Canada's renowned potato growing spot, though I must confess, Alliston does a pretty good job too. I am so far behind in the gardens department, of switching over the big urns from their spring regalia to a summer display. One of the good things about the cooler than normal spring is that the spring plants like the pansies and violas are able to flourish and look great still. I hope that by the time you are reading this, that magical transition has taken place. I have had most of the plants now for a couple of weeks at the side of the house. One of the other factors though, is that most of the plants that were part of the Easter display in front of the altar will find a second life in the gardens, so until that display came down, the urns couldn't be changed over anyway. Many of those plants were always meant to be added to the property somewhere, like the lilac trees, the spirea, and of course the spring bulbs. There is a section of the garden where we plant the Easter lily bulbs and some survive the winter to come up and bloom in the summer. I do have some plants that I overwintered in the garage and I want to use them. It is pretty satisfying to have some of the more exotic plants survive and return to the garden. I must admit, it is no thanks to me. Once I put them in the garage, I forgot to water them and yet they survived. Each garden season has important lessons to teach us, I guess. Of course, patience

is always a recurring theme, but I think what I take away this year, despite the loss To plant a garden is to of too many bigger plants like the lavender, or the butterfly bushes, or a couple of hydrangeas, or a beautiful rose bush, is that mother nature is very resilient, the garden is in control, and nature is, for the most part, extremely & generously, forgiving.
