Not being much of a history buff, I think my parents were surprised when I signed up for grade 11 World Politics. I have even less interest in politics than history, but this course always had a field trip to New York City. As the bus rolled into the Big Apple I remember marvelling as a subway train went by. I was mesmerized by the graffiti, the artistry and creativity. I think if you looked hard enough and long enough, a deep message began to emerge, that the artist was inviting me into a different way of seeing my reality. I've since learned that is precisely the role of art, to provoke or to challenge or to invite. Of all the many wonderful aspects of that trip, the main thing that has remained with me is the impression left by the graffiti artists. A few months ago, at the beginning of Lent, two banners were placed in the Worship Space. Nothing has been said about them or alluded to them. They were there to somehow invite people to reflect, or muse, or to coin a phrase, ruminate. Whether we realize it or not, even as our guest speaker Dr. Massimo Faggioli made mention of, the Church is in a period of revolution. The Second Vatican Council has unleashed a new energy into the Church inviting it to grow into a deeper expression of who it is called to be. We are invited to encounter a new and larger God; we are invited to discover a deeper sense of what it means to be human; we are invited to realize the true manifestation of what it means to be Church. It is all about growth - growth of spirit- growth of faith- growth of personhood. The status quo signals stagnation and death. As Dr. Faggioli made reference to, part of this spiritual revolution is being held back by lack of courage to move forward. The longing for a nostalgic vision of the Church that can be no more undermines the very Spirit that has been set free. So each of us must ask and answer the question of "What does my faith call me to be and do?" "What does it mean to accept our baptism as a great commissioning to live the kingdom of God?" "Is Church something we do or is Church who we are?" These are fundamental questions that the Church is struggling with. Someone asked me if they were "parish enough". That is a question that we can only answer for ourselves, but the collective fruit helps us see the answer. The surest thing though is that the Church is moving forward in becoming what it was meant to be. It is no longer something to be consumed but rather something that needs to be lived. So the question that we must grapple with each week until Christ returns is, "Are we parish enough?" So New York was okay. I never would describe it as a highlight, and I have no desire to re-visit it. I was glad I went but in all honesty, I wish I had taken something other than World Politics. It was not the most exciting place to celebrate my 17th birthday.
