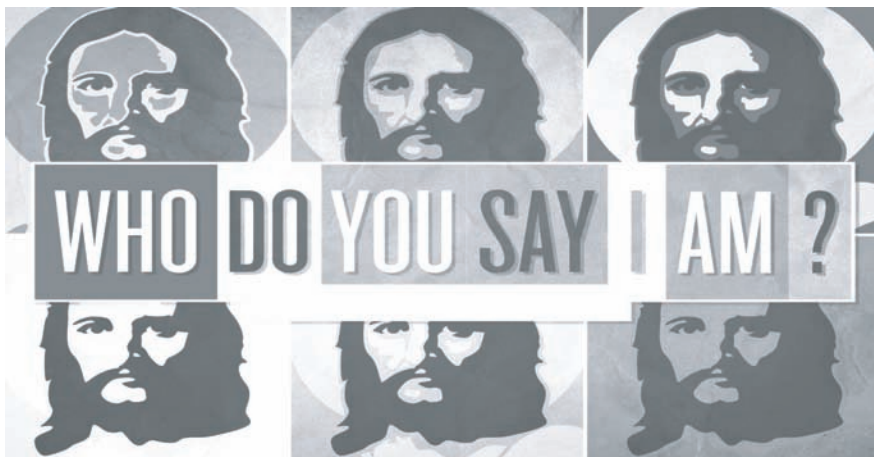

Ruminations...

Undoubtedly it has been a peculiar winter and spring. In fact, it has been unsettling. Usually the big clothing decisions are between umbrella or no umbrella, hat or no hat. Of late, one needs a high tech algorithm to decide between winter coat, spring coat, sweater or t-shirt, winter boots, shoes or sandals, shorts, pants or long johns, scarf, mitts... the combinations and permutations are endless. For a moment I thought of getting the size larger, but that just wouldn't look pretty, and I thought, maybe more wished or hoped, that I could fit into the size
