

A couple of weeks ago we celebrated the Sacred Heart High School closing mass. There was a time when this took place in the Church, but with the number of graduates and along with their parents, the church was just too small. This mass, weather permitting, would take place outside at the school. I must admit, it is a wonderful celebration, and the music department this year was phenomenal with a string orchestra accompanying the music. It was a bit too sunny as my face got a bit sunburned, but it was a glorious day until the end when the principal addressed everyone and reminded them that come September, Sacred Heart will celebrate 40 years of educational service. That was kind of a shot to the gut. It forced me to remember that Sacred Heart opened the September after I graduated grade 13 and was away to university. It just so happened that this past weekend some university friends were getting together and that meant I had known most of these people for forty years – four decades. That was mind blowing. And even if at times the period of time since the last meeting can creep up to maybe a decade, there is instant familiarity and the time lapse melts. It just means there is more to catch up on. The first conversation starts with life in the present. Years ago it was all about what the kids are doing and what schools they were going to. Now though, the kids are kind of a periphery conversation and things more important are put on the table – grandkids. Forty years ago I don't remember a single conversation alluding to anything remotely approaching conversations about grandchildren, and yet here we are, grandkids this and grandkids that. And I don't remember any conversations back then nearly as fascinating at the third generation. Not that those conversations about grandkids could ever be exhausted, things begin to drift back to those times when our lives were much more intersecting. There is a great fondness looking back at those adventures of youth, and I am sure that time has sifted out the unnecessary and embellished the essence. There has been a lot of living since then and what was interesting is how often the memories persisted but the names and the faces had dimmed. It was amazing how often the conversation stopped momentarily as collectively we tried to remember this person's name or that person's name, and who some of the names seem lost for good. Collectively though we were able to recall most of the names, but they were all bit players in a much larger story. Then as nature takes its course, there were discussions about doctors' appointments and procedures and surgeries, true to a maturing group. Someone had just seen the Lion King on stage and remarked how true it is this circle of life. My wish for all these high school grads moving on in their lives is the



blessings of good friends and lasting relationships. We departed commenting that it has been far too long since we had gotten together and we promised to do it more often. It was a wonderful day and the best part of it all was that I was the one bringing the average age down. That's what happens when you are the youngest. What a great feeling. *Fr. Roy*
