

So all the drawers have been emptied, all the closets vacated. The furniture has been removed and most of the walls covered with a couple of coats of off-white. As much as it reminds me of a ghostly scene, with all the memories and stories of a family life well lived, the house went on the selling block this past week. Gone are the marks on the wall from flying pucks from when my brothers would stand in the transition between the living room and the kitchen, and dad would toss the pucks so they could practice their goalie gloves. Each mark represented a goal they would have let in. The scrapes on the floor have been sanded off, and even though work socks were taped to the bottom of the hockey sticks for floor protection, there were still marks and scars as evidence of a hockey family. Long scheduled repairs were finally completed and a backyard cleanup was finally done. With almost an acre of land, it was easy to toss the fallen branches and trees into an invisible corner to be dealt with later. We gathered for one last time to peer out the patio windows along the stretch of the backyard and flashbacks of running up the hills with skates on to strengthen skating ankles and legs, soaring high on the tire swing from the old elm tree, playing baseball, throwing javelins, tobogganing, hide and seek, red rover, sleeping in the gazebo on hot summer nights, family picnics, playing fetch with the dog, collecting leaves from the various trees to be ironed under wax paper for school projects, planting the gardens, the trees, dare-devil flying down the hills on bikes, catching butterflies, throwing milkweed pods, then watching my nephews and nieces copy our adventures and invent adventures of their own, and the thousands of days spent enjoying our property... soon to be no more. It is hard sitting with realtors to coldly and impersonally quantity the term of sale with something that has been so much a part of our lives and our identity. It was tough to actually say that mom no longer lives in Holland Landing, especially when it wasn't her choice... The one saving grace which pales in comparison, is that the probable selling price will so exceed mom and dad's hopes and expectations. They took great pride in knowing that they would be able to leave a small inheritance to the four boys, and if the market proves to live up to its insanity, it will be a tidy little windfall. But that is small consolation. So in a very real way, it is an end of an era, not really



the way we hoped the story would end, but a great send off to a great home, and maybe the start of new adventures for another family for the next half century or more. Home fleet home. How quickly it passes. Sold!
