

Ruminations...

I had the good fortune to be invited to a Leaf's game when they won over Boston this past week. I was astounded by the number of Boston sweaters roaming around the arena. It is a vastly different experience. I am reminded every time I attend such events that seats are designed for numbers not comfort. My shoulders need to be at least six inches smaller and as I took my nephew who himself has a shoulder spread comparable to mine, it was a bit squishy at the ACC not to mention traveling on the crowded subway. But it is nice every once and awhile for such a treat. As a student of liturgy, what I find more fascinating than even watching Mitch Marner and his magic ice antics, is watching the crowd and the entertainment structures that fill in the lulls or what people see at home, the commercial breaks. There were two interludes that struck me in a marvelous way. They both involved music. One was Stompin' Tom's 'the Hockey Song', and the other was Neil Diamond's 'Sweet Caroline". In both instances, a huge majority of the 16,000 people in attendance burst into the chorus with loud, almost deafening volume. They were standing, some arm in arm with their new best friends who just happened to occupy the adjacent seat. I viewed this through the lens of liturgical principles, and this is exactly how liturgical music is supposed to work. It is meant to draw us together, invite one in, and thereby create a unity of people. The second epiphany was a note about the San Francisco quarterback who drew so much attention for refusing to stand for the American National Anthem as a protest against police violence to ethnic groups. It created an unbelievable stir, all over a simple change of posture. Who knew that such an action could become the focus of so much attention. Again, viewing this through a liturgical lens has something incredibly important to teach us church people. Especially in liturgy, everything we say and do has import in communicating fundamental statements of faith. That is why the Church has spent much thought in our postures during Mass, and every action, and word and posture is meant to communicate and convey an attitude and thereby help to transform us. The underlying principle in all our liturgical practices is unity, of making us understand that we are called to be one. "...to what serves the common spiritual good of the People of God, rather than private inclination or arbitrary choice. A common bodily posture, to be observed by all those taking part, is a sign of the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the Sacred Liturgy, for it expresses the intentions and spiritual attitude of the participants and also fosters them." That is why we are all called to stand together during the Eucharistic procession to manifest and foster the unity that the Eucharist demands. As the Church indicates that "they are to avoid any appearance of singularity or division...



This unity is beautifully apparent from the gestures and bodily postures observed together by the faithful. Please, let's work on our unity, to sing like Leaf fans (though admittedly, several beers may be necessary) and stand as one people.
