

Ruminations...

There is a quote attributed to John Heywood from 1546, "There are none so blind as those who will not see. The most deluded people are those who choose to ignore what they already know." It seems like a most appropriate expression as we enter into this fourth week of Lent. For those catechumen 'elect' preparing for baptism at Easter, the Gospel is the man born blind, and at their scrutiny they are asked to consider the blindnesses in their own lives. Blindness comes in many forms and for many reasons. Now as much as I am tempted to rant about the lack of liturgical unity which undermines the very nature of our Eucharist, those who kneel while the Church envisions us standing as one, rooted in a sense of this is what I want to do, versus surrendering selfishness to a communal expression of oneness, that is not what this is about. Now I know I risk emails, phone calls, and tsk tsks, but the whole notion of vincible ignorance came to light this past week. Sometimes in our quest for 'progress' we create a paralyzing selection of items; such as the times I had been standing in front of toothpaste shelves overwhelmed by the options and variations. There is a vast sense of helplessness and inadequacy, and eeny meeny miny moe is not an educated way to make the choice. I had the same powerless when I went to purchase some ahem! Gentlemen's under garments, unmentionables or delicates. Too many options and combinations, briefs, boxers, combinations thereof, high rise, low rise, coloured, striped plain, brand name, no name. I felt a little delinquent or perverse standing there mesmerized. I just wanted an ordinary type, like the ones I have been wearing all my life. Anyway in exasperation I selected a box and the next day as I donned them, they seemed a little too snug and uncomfortable, but after the traumatic experience of purchasing them, I remained undaunted and suffered through the day. When I went to my bedroom, I found the box still containing the other two pair and noticed that I had inadvertently picked up a box two sizes smaller than my personal requirements. No wonder. I reflected on this comical, yet poignant experience. Helplessness made haste. I was exasperated and wanted the episode over so I made a choice and moved on. Then I was too proud to really look at the box. Though it was on the right hanger in the store, it was not my size, and though my



wiggling into them should have clicked that something was wrong, the thought of needing to move into a larger size made me endure pain and suffering. A lesson in life-blinded by pride. And as the clerk at the store informed me, on some things there is no returns allowed. Fr. Rou

We celebrate the second scrutiny on the third Sunday of Lent and turn our hearts to the Gospel of the Man Born Blind. This week our elect will


be searching their hearts and responding to the question, "What are we blind to?"
