



## Ruminations ....

I remember the first time that I felt particularly technological modern. I always remind the school kids that I grew up B.C. – that is Before Computers. The arrival of the cable box that allowed us to change the channel between the 20 or so stations that the new installation of a cable line allowed was a huge deal. I didn't have a vast collection of albums but I did have a stereo with detachable speakers that could modestly, well not even remotely create that 'surround sound' sensation. Cassette tapes became all the rage. They were portable, easy to play, and with a pencil, easy to repair, for the most part – just stick the pencil through the wheel hole and twist, this is, provided the player hasn't severed the tape. I had a favorite tape with Huey Lewis and the News on one side, and Bruce Springsteen on the other, and in that ultra-modern arrival, when I got my Sony Walkman, it became my go to accompaniment as I went out jogging each night. I would jog a 2 mile loop and on days when things were feeling good, I would do it twice. On occasion I would vary the route for a 5 mile run, but this one included the big hill going out of the Landing. That was when I learned that big hills, not a fan unless you have skis and are going down. I remember that the first album I bought was a K-tel special. My first cassette tape was John Denver, but then came the advent of CD's. One of my first purchases after ordination was my very own stereo system complete with tuner and cd player that could hold 6 cds and randomly play any of the songs from the 6 cds, usually with a loud mechanical sound between as the one cd was removed and the other inserted. I still have that unit. To date, I have around 450 cds nicely sorted and arranged alphabetically by musician. They are housed on wonderful Ikea shelves specifically designed for such an occasion. I recently tried to acquire another shelving unit, but it has been discontinued – a sign of the times I guess. Anyway, not to be too antiquated, I did also indulge in an iPod so that my selected music could be portable for the gym or walks or the car or just connecting it to a blue tooth speaker and take it with me wherever. My project was to load all my cds onto the iPod. This was when I learned about storage on devices. It did not have enough storage, especially after I was given about 8,000 songs to upload on my device. I needed a bigger device. I have hemmed and hawed about it for a couple of years, but then Apple decided to discontinue the iPod. I did a quick search through stores to check out their inventory. Best Buy had one in Ottawa, but that was it. Even the Apple Store was low on inventories. I could find only one in Markham and so I quickly ordered it on line and picked it up the next day. Luckily all my music automatically transferred from my old iPod to the new one and so I don't have as much work to upload the rest of my music. I am not sure why this was important to me, especially since the format is once again becoming obsolete. It is not nostalgia. I think maybe I am just too cheap and or defiant to subscribe to those music services, especially knowing that all the music I want is stored conveniently on three storage units in my room, or maybe I am not as modern as I think. Here's to good ol' luddites.
