Well, it is not really an innate kindness that is motivating me. I have more selfish motives. The Silver Lakes course in Holland Landing has opened and I hear that they have a phenomenal new young chef working the kitchen. Well, that young chef is my nephew, fresh back from Ireland with a pending Bachelor of Arts in Culinary Arts. With the Irish training, I anticipate that the potato French fries should be outstanding. Plus, now that he is earning a wage, he can start paying off his debt. Amen.
