Report on the work of the Newmarket Society of St. Vincent de Paul for the year 2020.

1 May, 2021

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

First of all, thank you for your continued financial support. Combined, the people of Newmarket donated \$125,857 toward the work of our society in 2020 - almost all of that money coming from the parishioners of the two Newmarket parishes of St John Chrysostom and St Elizabeth Seton. This was an amazingly generous response in the circumstances. So, how did we use the \$119,889 that we spent of your donations?

Our Conference offers four main ways of helping the families and individuals in need who come to us:

- 1. Good Food Box: A monthly package of fresh vegetables and fruit valued at \$15 from the York Region Food Network; larger families in need may receive this twice per month. In 2020 we sponsored 748 of these Good Food Boxes \$11,220.
- 2. Grocery Food Cards (Food Basics/Metro): Families and individuals in need also need to buy other groceries not available in the Good Food Box and may request food cards from our Society for this purpose once every 3 months \$20 per family member plus \$20 for the household. Is this enough? Of course not, but it is all our budget will allow at present. In 2020 we distributed food cards to a total value of \$39,100 to 228 different families and individuals in need. However, if we are to increase the frequency of grocery aid from every 3 months to every 2 months, we would need to budget an extra \$19,550 an increase of 50%.
- 3. Christmas Programs: This last year, pandemic constraints forced us to abandon the traditional way of selecting stars from the Giving Tree and bringing gifts. Nevertheless, your financial gifts this past Christmas enabled us to provide Christmas cheer for approx. 280 individuals who are seniors, shut-ins or families in shelters. In addition, your contributions to our Christmas Program for families with children enabled 136 of our families in need to buy food and gifts for 195 adults and 307 children. We reported separately on this already in January of this year. The total value of these two programs was \$53,181.
- 4. Special Needs: They say that most families in Canada are just one, two or three pay cheques away from being homeless. Sometimes a family finds themselves in a crunch and needs a leg up or a helping hand to keep their home (for example) or to have a decent bed for a senior with a health condition. We have a budget of \$500 per month to help one or two such families at a time.

Last year it is estimated that your Vincentians, all volunteers who see their work as a ministry to the Body of Christ, spent over 4,000 hours ensuring that your donations went to the people who needed assistance, especially food assistance – for the low cost of only 2% on administration.


