

## **Ruminations** ....

Almost thirty years ago I was stationed at St. Mary's Parish in Collingwood for my seminarian intern year. It was quite an adventure getting there as for most of the summer I had been told I was going to be stationed at St. Margaret Mary in Woodbridge. Anyway, as an avid skier in my younger days, it seemed like a match made in heaven. To top it off, some of my university friends had settled there to live out their teaching careers. Between skiing and canoeing, and hiking and school visits, it was a great introduction to non-city living. So it is a stretch to think of it as a vacation spot. As someone who has difficulty finding a destination to go, it was as good as any other, and besides, the town has grown exponentially in the last three decades. One of those things on my list of places to visit, Tobermory has been up there. I'm not sure if it is the fact that it is the peninsula nature of it, or the ending of the Niagara Escarpment, there has always been a rustic, wilderness appeal to it. So on Monday I headed up to that Unesco Biosphere Reserve not sure of what to do, or what would be open. The only thing I knew was that the rattle snakes would be hibernating, and I was hoping the bears were too. As I've mentioned, I have this deep somewhat irrational fear of bears in the wilderness. I thought I had packed appropriate clothing, lots of layers and fleece. One thing I didn't consider was the wind, and the howling wind went right through the fleece. On top of the six storey lookout tower, the wind brought tears to my eyes and it was almost impossible to enjoy the panoramic view. On the trails there was enough protection from the trees to make it tolerable. I hadn't planned on hiking so I had only my regular shoes. Walking through a forest filled with rocks and roots was a challenge. It was beautiful though, as the trail was covered with birch leaves in an abstract palette of golds and greens. It seemed almost like the yellow brick road. There were some interestingly gnarled trees that created an eerie setting as the overcast day and fog made the trip very primeval. There were a couple of thoughts that kept my mind occupied, of course bears, so every odd noise caught my attention. The second one was the fine line between adventurousness, stupidity and foolhardiness. Here I was with ill-equipped shoes, on a difficult trail, alone and the



daylight waning, and as I got tired, my feet started to act up, not lifting up, part of the spine operation. I decided to cut the trail short and head back. So as I was within sight of the end of the path, I glimpsed my first wildlife, thankfully not a bear. A red squirrel darted across the path almost under foot and scared the life out of me. Red squirrels are now in the same category as chipmunks. It was a good day.
