Ruminations

Sometimes I think I am jinxed when it comes to in person banking interactions. The last episode has not been completely rectified but there was some satisfaction. We didn't get our bank card but we did get access to our account in ways that have made our lives easier. Well, once again it was time to deposit all our candle money. Now with most of those deposits are heavy with loonies and toonies and so we are unable to drop them into the night deposit box, one because they rarely fit through the narrow slot and secondly because the bag runs the risk of breaking open and spilling all out. Our bank of record no longer deals with cold hard cash so we must do all cash transactions at the Green Lane branch. So in I went with two heavy bags for deposit. I must say from the start that the bank teller was exceptionally nice and she had nothing to do with the procedure. As she checked the credentials, I was told that I did not have authorization on the parish account. Authority remained with the previous Pastor who hasn't been here for over ten years. This was part of the same issue the last time with the Bank. She searched high and low, she found a bank account for St. Elizabeth Seton somewhere in the States, in Wisconsin I think. She said I guess that is not you. She guessed right. Each attempt I explained that I had been through this a couple of years back and everything was supposed to have been updated. What happens when a new pastor moves into a parish, the Archdiocese provides a letter of introduction to transfer the authority to the new pastor. I did this and things were going swimmingly, until they weren't. The poor teller must have logged a couple thousand steps on her Fitbit, going from one manager to another. Everyone was as perplexed and unable to do anything as she was. I was the only one who had an inkling of what was happening, but unfortunately I didn't know how to resolve it. The minutes ticked by eventually taking about a banker's hour. One manager came over and said I would have to make an appointment and come in to 'rectify' the account. I said I had an appointment several years to this very thing and it was a two hour meeting. The manager became a bit testy and so then did I. I asked why I would have to this again because the bank has somehow messed up, again. He said I don't have authority to which point I inquired, "does that mean you have been cashing the cheques for our parish for the last ten and a half years under the wrong authority?" So I quipped asking if they are going to return the ten years of cheques that they cashed illegally then." I say he didn't have a sense of humour but I'm not so sure I was trying to be funny. Then the nice teller broke in and we figured out a way, that since I also have an account with that bank, she deposited the money using my bank card, but into the Parish account. Again, she was very nice, but to the snarky manager I left a few hostile words, "If it were up to me (which it is not) I would close this account and move it to one that doesn't continually screw it up." So what now? I reported them to



the Archdiocese finance department who assured me that I was not the only priest with this problem and they would look into it and straighten it out. I asked why we were still using them, especially since the quality of their commercials has declined over the years. I hope I never have to go in there again.
