## **Ruminations...**

It has been one of those incredibly fast-paced weeks when there was scarcely time to breath. It seemed that there was just one project after another, from ensuring that a loaf of bread for each family has been ordered for this weekend, to arranging the moving of the statue to the front of the Worship Space for the unveiling. It has somewhat slowed down - somewhat. But lots of times these busy activities require lots of errand runs for this or that. I think the staff at Home Depot and Michael's know me by name. I remember when Halley's Comet went by in 1985 thinking that I will likely never see it again. I would be 101 years old the next time it cycles by in 2061. Mark Twain was born the year the Comet appeared and predicted his death when it returned, and he died the day it was once again visible, kind of neat in a romantic way. The reason I was thinking about it was because in the midst of another one of those last minute excursions to take care of last minute details, I was racing back along the Green Lane and as I turned onto the Green Lane, from Yonge St., the "extra super moon" was just rising over the 404 highway. All along the Lane it was mesmerizing watching this gigantic rose hued orb suspended in the sky. It was breath-takingly beautiful and just seemed to quell all the anxiousness and hurriedness of the week's events. November is naturally a time of reflection, on life and death, mortality and immortality. So this super moon seemed to capture the imagination of people. It was talked about in the media and around the water cooler and even though there are several super moons a year, this extraordinary phenomenon will not take place to such a degree of size and brightness until November 2034. I hope to be around as that is the year of my scheduled retirement, (the priest retirement is 75 years – or the Lotto Max winning ticket, whichever comes first), but so much can happen, so much life still has to take place. So I pulled off to the side of the road just to marvel and admire the beauty of God's handy work, caught up in the magic and magnitude of the night sky, and catch my breath from the onslaught of details. That is part and parcel of this season as the days shorten and the cold overtakes the warmth of summer. How fortunate we are to live in a place that experiences the yearly rhythms of the seasons, encountering the mystery of life



and death and the promise of re-birth. How glorious a creation that bestows the palette of Fall colours, the magic of the Leonid meteor showers, the fidelity of Halley's Comet, and the magnificence of an extra Super full moon. November isn't so much the month of the dead as it is an invitation to the appreciation of the gift of life. What a great way to enter into our spiritual preparation for Christmas.
