Ruminations

The advent of Advent always make me think back to my university days in Sudbury. It is not just because there was always snow on the ground, but the first Sunday of Advent marked the last big celebration before exams and the sporadic departure of students for home for the Christmas break. Those who were in French teachers' College always got to leave earliest. They never had exams as such and so on the first Sunday there was a mass exodus mostly to points north. Then over the course of the next couple of weeks, the rest of us would eventually finish exams and then pack up for home. It always seemed like the Sports Administration students had to remain until the bitter end. Bitter because as the residence emptied, this nagging jealousy started to grow especially as those friends who were already home would call and rub it in how much relief and fun they were having. But that first Advent weekend was a big deal. It was our Christmas formal. All the floors spend a week or two decorating the walls, painting glorious scenes of winter and Christmas, and wrapping their doors with Christmas paper. And the Student Council found time between studying for exams, or more likely to avoid studying for exams to prepare the meal. There was a schedule of activities that was followed precisely each year. Potatoes were peeled on Wednesday, and vegetables prepared on Thursday. The salad was tossed on Friday along with the buttering of the buns. Thankfully Frere Viau was in charge of the many turkeys that needed to be cooked to feed two hundred students, and he made the most amazing turkey dressing. The evening would begin with a big Mass celebrated in the Grand Salon. It too was festooned with Christmas decorations hanging from the ceiling, and covering the windows. The piece de resistance was always the huge Christmas tree that adorned the corner in front of the grand piano. It had to be fifteen feet high or more, and it required a big ladder to dress it with lights. The star on top was the only ornamentation other than the copious amounts of lights. I suppose one of the benefits of a northern university was access to beautiful giant Christmas trees. The mass was a Christmas celebration of sorts. I can't remember if we used the Christmas readings, but the music was all Christmasy in nature. One of my favorite musical memories was the Our Father sung to Gordon Lightfoot's 'Song for a Winter's Night'. With snow falling, and the tree aglow, and everyone present dressed for the formal occasion, it seemed perfect. One of the Jesuits who taught there was a concert pianist as well, and he always regaled us with incredible music to mark the occasion. After mass the Hall was cleared so the tables could be set up and the food brought out, and the serenity of Mass was replaced by the cacophony of nervous excitement of students letting loose before the onslaught of the exams. And as much fun as it was, it still paled in comparison of the excitement of getting home for Christmas. On the long, local bus ride home, there was lots of time for reflection, staring out the window and watching the snow and rocks and trees of Ontario's north. The pang of missing friends who had departed for their own homes melted the closer to home I got. When the bus passed the sign



welcoming us to Simcoe County, I felt like I was home, even though there was still an hour to the bus depot in Barrie and then another 35 minutes to home. That last hour seemed like a perfect transition – time to leave the stress of exams behind and anticipate and mentally prepare for the coming break at home. That sounds pretty much like a perfect Advent theme.



Time for New Carpeting

We need to work on getting new carpet for the church & the hall. There are many reasons none the least of which is that the Insurance Company on their annual inspections have singled it out as a priority (and I think there is an implied or else in there). The building committee has been working to get pricing and arrangements and colours and the like. The long and the short of it is that the church prices out at \$30,000 and the Hall comes in at just over \$20,000. The CWG has pledged \$5,000; the Knights have pledged \$2,000 (with more to come depending on the sale of the Christmas trees so buy a tree) and the Fish Fry has committed \$4,000. We are almost half way there for the church. The church is the first on the priority list so as soon as we reach the magic \$30,000 we will proceed with its installation, and later if and when we can cover the cost of the hall, it too will be done.
