

Back when there were way fewer television channels to watch, we were kind of stuck with two, sometimes three channels. One of those boring afternoon shows was the Galloping Gourmet cooking show, where, as history has revealed, the chef became less and less sober as the show went on. Cooking shows were never that popular until the recent rash of reality television. So I have always felt somewhat comfortable in the kitchen. The first batch didn't go so well. I dropped an entire egg, shell, white and yolk into the mixture. I have never done that, ever! I knew that the recipe called for butter but I didn't see it come up as I followed the instructions line by line. When I pulled them out of the oven, they looked odd, tasted great, but I knew something was amiss. That was when I realized I totally missed the butter. As the night and then Saturday morning went on, the addition of the butter certainly made it better. On the last batch I realized that I was supposed to add the remaining sugars to the filling mixture. I had no remaining sugar. I had added it all to the cookie mixture. Anyway, after Saturday mass I had to rush to Metro for some whip cream. I got there and discovered my wallet was not in my jacket pocket. I rushed back and hunted and hunted for the wallet. It was nowhere to be found. It was odd because I usually keep my wallet in my jacket pocket, so I reached in only to discover that I was not wearing my jacket, I was wearing my chef's coat, both of which are black and both of which have the same Well, the end result was fine, the blueberry cups with the Cointreau was absolutely exquisite,



the peach with vodka was delicious, the cherries were a jubilee, and the apples, and well they were apples. So, there were four batches of great tasting cookie tarts, and one mistake that tasted good too. But let's just say they came out of our own version of "Hell's Kitchen."






