Thanksgiving always evokes such fond memories. First, it was always a celebration where we got to celebrate it at home. Usually we were either off to the farm with that protestant side of the family, or hop-scotching between the two sets of grandparents in Oak Ridges. Thanksgiving was like this great time to breathe and a relaxed weekend of home stuff. Even when coming home from university, it was home time and all the other relatives who wanted to have a visit and be regaled with stories of campus life, understood that it was a very short stay especially when it took almost a full day of bus travel to get home and a full day to return. On those fair weather days we would all sit out on the deck amidst the colourfully changing trees and just shoot the breeze. I think this is why mom and dad claimed Thanksgiving as their favorite holiday by far. It was a very relaxed and easy holiday. Updated Archdiocesan Policy for Local Parishes

The Archdiocese has issued policies for life in the Parish. The default position for employment in the Parish is to be fully vaccinated. If a staff member is not fully vaccinated they will need to provide proof of a negative Covid test on a weekly basis.

For those carrying out ministries, the Archdiocese has implemented temporary requirements recommending that only fully vaccinated people participate in ministry at this time. Provision is allowed for the pastor to waive this requirement so long as a weekly proof of a negative Covid test is provided. (This is the policy we will adopt in this Parish.)

Organizations such at the CWG or Knights of Columbus are not the responsibility of the Parish but their meetings are governed by Provincial and or local Health agencies. These require anyone participating in these meetings or events must be fully vaccinated. There is no loop-hole allowing them to be covered under the umbrella of Worship Space. Meetings for Sacramental preparation like parents' meetings do fall under the regulations of Parish Worship spaces and proof of vaccination is not required at this time.

There is no exemptions from vaccinations based on religious grounds. This comes directly from the Vatican. The Vatican states emphatically that it is "morally acceptable to us the available Canadian vaccines."

The Archdiocese has determined that weekly testing is an acceptable alternative to vaccination.

Masks remain mandatory at all indoor functions.

These remain temporary measures until further notice.


