Ruminations by Deacon Stephen Pitre....

I was given the opportunity to be one of 1500 volunteers serving 600 athletes and 1400 family and friends in attendance at the Invictus Games. Together with 9 other chaplains, representing the five major faith groups we formed the Multi Faith Center in the Athletes Village at the Sheraton Hotel downtown. Spiritual care is an important part of the recovery process for many of the competitors and families thus the need for chaplains.

"Invictus", the Latin word for "Unconquered", is the title of a poem by influential English poet William Ernest Henley written in the late 19th century. The speaker in the poem proclaims his strength in the face of adversity. He concludes "I am the master of my fate, I am the master of my soul."

Competitors were selected on the basis of who would benefit the most in their recovery from participating in these games. Each competitor was allowed to bring 2 friends and or family at no cost upon arrival in Toronto.

As volunteers we were there to make the athletes and their families feel welcomed and appreciated for their service. As members of the Multifaith Centre we were there to provide a place for quiet reflection and rest from all the busyness of the games and a respectful listening ear to those who felt the need to talk.

There were many encounters with the service men and woman and their families, along with the volunteers that I could recount but I will recount just two of them.

The first night I met three couples from the Jordanian team. All three of the wives were in wheelchairs due to the loss of their legs and their husbands were their care givers, helping their wives to move from place to place. All six of these people radiated a peace and joy that touched your heart and moved you in ways you can only imagine. Each time we met them they were so thankful for our volunteering at the games and supporting them.

Another veteran, who was in a wheel chair, was there with his wife and three young daughters, age's three to eight. They spoke of the challenges they faced at home. They asked if they could have one of the Bibles we were giving away and I said of course. Then the girls each asked if they could have one and again I said of course. The father then handed me a card, in which he had written his version of the Invictus poem. The most striking and heart moving line in the card after the poem was, "Please accept this small token as a memory of a special moment in time. Kind regards to you and your family."

Throughout the games, as I watched these competitors and their families, blessed to meet so many of them and hear their stories, knowing that they had to go home and continue to face the road of recovery, with all of its difficulties and challenges, I will never forget their sense of hope and their deep belief, that while life had changed, life was worth living. They truly gave witness to their "Invictus" spirit, their unconquerable spirit and were an inspiration to all of us. I think they were the true "chaplains."
