

There was a time when Sunday had its own civilized and relaxed rhythm. It was a day like no other. Stores were not open. Sunday morning cartoons were boring and unexciting with the likes of 'Davy & Goliath'. Morning show were wholly unworthy watching. There was nothing to do and the most exciting thing to look forward to was the weekly visit to the grandparents' house. On any given weekend there would be a slew of cousins to play with, and across the road was a school playground. As we amused ourselves in the great outdoors, when all else failed, there was always taking the big, huggable German Shepherd, King, for a walk or rather, he would take us for a walk. It also meant that we could feed him. There was usually a line up to feed him because it meant that with grandma's helping hand, we got to use the miraculous electric can opener. The rush, and confusion, seemed counter to having a tranquil day, so we had submarine sandwiches, little muss and fuss, and a very peaceful day just being in each other's company and no worries about who was bringing what, or whose turn it was to clean



up. Just the quiet and relaxed pause in an otherwise busy life was reason enough to give thanks. In the expression 'pause and give thanks', the pause is as important as the give thanks.
