Thanksgiving was a very relaxed affair. No one was too concerned about not having turkey. It was a smorgasbord of Mr. Greek, Chinese and pizza and there was ample leftovers. Of course, three of the young ones have the opportunity to vote this year in the federal election, two for the first time. We talked a bit about the election but more about ensuring that they were doing their civic duty and were voting. I really didn't want to know too much because, as a politic cynic, I didn't have much to offer in terms of hope, and even if I did, the Law prevents me in my position to render support for anyone less we lose our Charitable standing. It isn't too much of a burden because there isn't one I can honestly endorse anyway. Well, my nephews and nieces I regaled with stories of the good ol' days and the Rhinoceros party. For all intents and purposes, they were a means of giving voice to discontent with the current government structures and voting options. When the pundits lament the lack of voter turnout, rarely do they equate it with a sense of helplessness and futility with current rosters and We currently sit bombarded by a promised spending platforms. frenzy of options and plans to lure our vote. It is like a stick full of money enticements to decoy us away from deeper issues. Our political agendas are reduced to superficial soundbites and delusional strategies. Lots of times people ask about becoming a priest and my parental influence. My mom always said she had two prayers, one that we would never become a lawyer and the second we would never become a politician. So I am not sure for whom I will be voting. ON the one hand I envy those who seem to see a light at the end of the tunnel. Me, I cannot imagine my name associated with any of the leaders- the de facto dictator with a Machiavellian strategistthe nice hair, un-substantive totalitarian who excludes prolife candidates espousing popularist platforms to lure the unassum-



ing - the great unknown leader whose party gives me the willies – the great untried party that has no experience. All I know is it is my civic duty to exercise this right and I will. Until they put an option for "none of the above" does anyone have nose plugs I can borrow? Fr. Roy.
