

Ruminations...

I think I have an affinity for the sea. I love the roar of waterfalls, the crashing of waves against the rocks on the shore, the constant rhythm of waves lapping the water's edge. While on basic training at Esquimalt in British Columbia, we would go to spend some time out on the big boats, the mine sweeps. The best night's sleep I ever had was sleeping in the impossible births of those ships with the fresh salt air of the Pacific ocean filling the room, and the boat gently rocking to the swells of the ocean. I had been canoeing often enough to be comfortable with the craft, and I have had oodles of blisters from the rowboat on the pond at the farm. Somehow sitting backwards to where you are going is not my idea of a fun day on the water. The first time I got to try a kayak was on the sunny shores of Georgian Bay in Collingwood. I was the seminarian assistant and the pastor had a kayak so one sunny spring day, I mounted the kayak on my car and headed to the park. I was out for a couple of hours just paddling around the rocks and islands near the shore, and I had the wicked sunburn to prove it. It was a wonderful adventure and one that I had hoped to duplicate. Well last week was the first time I really made a concerted effort to go kayaking. It has been almost 30 years since the last time, so I thought it was now or never. I scheduled my day to make it to Warsaw Provincial Park east of Peterborough. I rented the kayak at the main gate and walked into the park heading towards the boat launch where I was to unlock the kayak and hop in. As the rest of my trip went, I got a bit lost walking through the trees and paths of the park. It was a beautiful walk, but the time was ticking and I had only an hour and a bit to get my fix of paddling. Eventually I found the boat lock up and I placed my gear on the dock and retrieved the kayak. All gung-ho I put the kayak into the river along the shore and stepped in. Well, anyone with any experience realizes that one does not just step into a kayak. It almost threw me into the river, but I regained my balance and tried again. The boat kept moving away from the shore and I was sure I was going to be split in two. Finally without any grace or poise I plopped into the seat. The beautiful meandering Indian River was a joy to navigate, no matter how nervous I felt in this tippy boat. It was silent and clear and peaceful. Eventually I returned to the launch and began the fruitless exercise of trying to get out of the kayak. Again it was not pretty and after a few near misses and futile attempts I got standing up, only to have the boat lurch forward spilling me into the river. With scrapes up and down my shins, and soaked shoes and socks, I thanked God no one was around to see this. Even so, I slogged my way back to the gate house to return the key after a satisfying journey. The only thing I didn't realize however, was that kayaking can be a blood sport. Shin pads for the next trip. Fr. Roy
