Ruminations

I was gathering with some friends and it was my volunteered responsibility to bring dessert. I don't mind being the dessert person because it offers an opportunity to be creative and to try something new and different. Now cheesecake really isn't different until you add the toppings. I found a recipe called Caramel Apple Cheesecake, with caramel sauce that I had never attempted before and an apple topping laced with an apple bourbon I had never heard of before. In fact, I wasn't even sure what section of the Liquor Store I could find it. That in itself is quite an adventure. I always feel lost and a tad fraudulent being in there since the alcohol is never for me, and I fear they will ask me questions that I haven't a clue about. Anyway, after wondering around the shelves for a while, a worker asked me what I was looking for. She said it would be found in the liqueur section, not the wine section. Who knew? I still couldn't find it and so she came up again and realizing I wasn't having much success, she hunted for it. She couldn't find it either. I felt somewhat vindicated. She trotted off to see what the issue was and shortly came back with a bottle of Apple Bourbon. It has been located at a highlight shelf and not where it was supposed to be. While I was out I decided to see if I could find a cake pedestal to display this gourmet dessert. Into Home Sense I went. Now these types of stores are little shops of horror. Every step, every touch, is fraught with the scary possibility of breaking something, and being somewhat of a klutz, I can feel my heart rate increase, my blood pressure escalate and beads of sweat forming as soon as I enter. Every movement is done with great caution and precision. I found a very interesting and decorative pedestal and as I struggled to bring it off the shelf, it kind of just slid off the display stand and dropped about an inch onto the shelf. Of course it broke. My fears had been realized. I quickly scanned around to see if anyone had noticed and no one did, apparently. I just wanted to dash out, but I left the broken dish there and started for the washroom. It took a couple of minutes to calm down and once I was assured that no heart attack was imminent, I was in a moral conundrum. I decided to fess up and took the broken piece up to the cashier as I had another pedestal that was plain and really was a guilt buy. I explained that I would pay for it but she just gave me a wink, thanked me for my honesty (if she only knew the thoughts I had) and said accidents happen all the time here. No charge. I breathed a sigh of relief and thanked her ly. So I made the recipe early in the week to make sure I could accomplish it and it worked out great, looked great, and tasted great, though I wasn't keen on the apple bourbon and I decided to use Grand Marnier instead. When I made the 'official' take to dinner to impress' version, it was an unmitigated disaster. The caramel sauce was a touch burned, the cheesecake didn't set as it wasn't in the fridge long enough, and the apple concoction went beyond fresh and looked very unappetizing. The whole thing kind of just melted out of form and it could never be put on the

pedestal- it just kept running all over the container. Well it still tasted okay, for presentation marks of one out of ten, and taste marks of six and a half out of ten. Next time I think it will be Sara Lee cherry cheesecake. It would have saved time, money and anxiety.

Movember is Coming


