Ruminations

Allergies were not a big thing growing up. Bee stings, peanut butter, pollens – there were just a natural part of life and food restrictions were non-existent, save for the pickiness of some people whose list of non-edibles was quite extensive, like mushrooms or cauliflower or seafood, or meat with bones in it. One of our neighbours had to carry an epi-pen for bee stings, but other than a couple of brothers who feigned allergies to school, we seemed to get off very lightly. The first issue was dad. One day he broke out in hives all over his body. It seems he had a reaction to apple cider. That was too bad. Because although dad didn't imbibe, he loved a cold glass of freshly pressed apple cider. Much later we discovered mom had a sensitivity to morphine. After her colon resection, they had a hard time bringing mom around, so now all her charts mention that particular condition. I've long known that I have reactions to alcohols of all flavours. The reaction is not one of standing on tables and dancing the night away, but the appearance of red blotches all over my face. I'm not sure if it is a true allergy or just a sensitivity- I've never had it tested. Let's just say it saved me an awful lot of money over the years and especially at university. I think that is how I was debt free at graduation. So it was rather a shock when these red bumps began to appear on my arms and legs, and across my stomach, and they were itchy. I woke up in the middle of the night and spent an hour and a half scratchy – you might have noticed me yawning more than usual at Sunday morning masses. My first thought was that I contracted shingles, so every nurse I know in the parish had to endure looking at these symptoms and assuring me that they were not shingles. Assured that I was shingle free my next thought was some kind of allergic reaction so I tried to think of anything new happening – new soap or shampoo, new laundry detergent, new foods. Nothing came to light. Speculating that it might be dietary I tried eliminating foods to no avail. The days began to stretch into weeks and nothing caused the dots to disappear. Lignocaine helped a bit with the itching, but the spots remained. I looked at this week's seminar as an opportunity to experiment. I was thrust out of my normal eating habits anyway so it was my last ditched effort to resolve the issue before conceding to actually going to my doctor. I left Monday afternoon and by Tuesday morning things were getting better. I considered maybe I was allergic to the parish, but then I remembered dad and his apple cider woes. I had gone without apples for breakfast for the first time in years. Now I am writing this after only one day, and because of deadlines....I

hope to wake up tomorrow with fewer and fewer spots on my body. Time will tell. What amused me most though was I guess I am following in my dad's footsteps. At least in terms of apples it seems, like father like son. Thanks dad. Now what can I have for breakfast?
