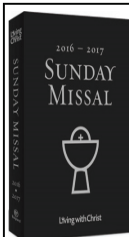

## Ruminations...

So, the St. Francis Retreat Centre near Orangeville was in fine array. The leaves are in their full autumn glory splashed with reds and oranges and golds against a backdrop of splendid green pine trees. Whenever they caught the sun it was magical. Though most of the morning, afternoon, and evenings were spent in meetings, the room was filled with huge windows that brought the outdoor scenery into our midst. These liturgy meetings are incredibly fun and enlightening for a bunch of liturgists, but I know most normal people would be bored silly. Who really cares how long the liturgical books are held up in Rome waiting for their approval, or how the French version of the Gospel book will cost about 5 times as much as the English version because it needs to be printed in Europe. Few people would be excited about the National Liturgy Office's liturgical priorities, or the selection process for the particular shade of ink, (o.k. to be honest, that wasn't remotely interesting). It was just good to be surrounded by people working to bring the vision of the Church to all corners of the Province. As much as it was great to be there, when Thursday morning rolled around, it was good to be heading home. The drive along number 9 highway was gorgeous. The roads were a bit slick but everything was fine, until.....at the stop lights at the 400 highway, waiting for the light to turn green, I happened to glance in my rear view mirror and noticed that the car behind me was approaching just a bit too quickly.
