

Ruminations...

Last week I went to visit a friend who was celebrating her 84th birthday. When I first met her she said that her name was Mary Teresa Johanna Flynn Ross but everyone calls her Mary T. She takes great delight in sharing her birthday with the feast of the Canadian Martyrs. She is currently a resident in Providence Villa in Scarborough, a place she had worked in for years as a pastoral visitor. She is a feisty, stubborn old Irish Woman (not that I've met any other kind). While I was there another couple came in to bestow their best wishes, and inevitably she will relate the story of our first meeting. It was my first day back to the parish in Ajax. It was a Friday morning and the intention for that morning was her late husband. She was not part of that parish for many reasons, but she happened to live around the corner and so for the occasion of her late husband's birthday, she had arranged the Mass. After the mass she came up and asked me where I was from, so I told her Holland Landing. She dismissed that a bit annoved and repeated, "Where are you from?" I said again, "Holland Landing.' Exasperated she asked, "What parish are you from?" That is when I learned that city folk identity themselves by their parish, we country folk by our town. Once the conversation found an even keel, she related her pride at being from St. Helen's Parish in Toronto. I said that my mom grew up in her early years in that Parish. Well, then came all the questions about 'her people' and school attendance. As chance would have it, it seems that the Flynn backyard abutted the Donnelly backyard. She was anxious to meet my mom and continue the historical exploration. So a lunch was arranged. Of course there were friends and acquaintance in common, and stories of such and such a nun as teacher or principal, and stories of the old priests at St. Helen's. My mom had dug up some of her old (black and white old) school pictures and even her first communion class. As the lunch became an afternoon of conversation, they finally began to look at the pictures. When Mary T. looked at the photo, a big grin spread across her face. Amidst that class of grade one's all dressed in white gowns were several grade 8 girls who were called 'angels' and who acted as assistants to help keep orderly lines and straight rows. One of those angels happened to be Mary T. herself. She was indeed in my mother's first communion picture albeit as my mother insists, Mary T. was much, much older. Well in her mind that made us family and as the years have passed, it has proven to be the case. Happy Birthday 84th Mary T.
