Ruminations...

Mom and Dad always maintained that Thanksgiving was far and away their favorite family celebration. There was always an air of serenity and relaxation that permeated the whole weekend. It was never rushed or overly busy. We didn't usually go out to the farm, and so it was a quiet affair, especially when we celebrated it BGC, or before grandchildren. There was ample room around the table, and usually lots of food for seconds, unlike AGC, after grandchildren. When they arrived, leftovers were never part of the equation, in fact, they became non-existent except for the turnip and carrot concoction that few people enjoyed but mom thought was a thanksgiving staple - a must have to make it thanksgiving. The one year my brother was home from the seminary and I was home from Collingwood, the community where I spent my year in the parish. We had invited another seminarian to dinner since there was room around the table (remember it was before grandkids) as he had no real place to go. To protect the innocent, we will refer to him as 'John Doe', or 'John' for short. John too was in his parish year and as we were waiting to sit down to dinner, he was a no show. This was also before cell phones so there was no way of calling him to find out what was going on. Just as we had started to dig in, his car pulled into the drive way. He apologized for being late and signaled for me to come out and help him with something in his car. As it turned out, the parish where he was stationed had had a dinner the night before and he was transporting 108 pieces of pie, apple, Boston cream, cherry and pumpkin. I questioned him as to what seven people around the dinner table are going to do with all that pie. He responded that he didn't want it to go to waste. This was a typical adventure with 'John'. Well we carried on still a bit stunned by the absurdity when we noticed a car outside slowly driving by the house. It is a quiet neighbourhood so such things as slow moving cars are a spectacle. Then horror overwhelmed us when they tried to pull into our driveway. Our driveway can be difficult as there is a four foot drop and the driver hit the drop head on. Over the side we watched as the car tipped into the ditch. It was about then that 'John' informed us that he took the liberty of inviting a few friends up. This too was typical 'John'. Dinner



was over as the rescue of the car moved into high gear. Luckily most people in our quiet neighbour saw or heard the happening and soon a couple of pickup trucks arrived to pull the car out. Well, eventually when 'John' and his entourage left, loaded with 108 pieces of pie, did we ever give thanks.
