Ruminations

It is so hard to believe how quickly the summer has passed by. The first day back to school was always recounting about what we did during the summer. Well, here it goes. Although the Office was on summer hours and bulletins were published once a month, and although schools were on vacation and most of the organizations took a summer hiatus, there was lots going on. The kitchen saga continues. Plans are afoot to repair the damage from the flood back in May. Insurance claims have been submitted and permission to proceed has been granted. Yay, the kitchen is getting a new counter top and maybe even a new refrigerator. The present fridge has been on the last legs for a couple of years and it has been included in repair budgets for at least that long, and although it is still kicking, it is making funny noises that signal that it could be any day or month or make it through another year but now the time is right so we are watching for good sales. It is reported that July was the hottest month on record and in response very little yard work was accomplished. There were plans for so much more but it was all dependent on sane working temperatures so maybe as the thermometer drops, it will become an autumn project. We have had several meetings with experts about changing the lightbulbs, including an energy audit. There are some government rebate programs that return somewhere between 20 – 40 % on the price of the highly efficient LED bulbs. It would be wonderful to see the decrease in the hydro bill, and since they are promised to last for over seven years, the necessity of climbing up ladders, erecting scaffolding and laying tables over the pews to access the lights will be finished, at least for a while. The insurance company has been 'recommending' various projects that need to be done - or else! So if you noticed in the Spring, the catch basins in the parking lot were replaced, and the exit by the choir was cleaned out of any obstacles and a burnt out exit light was replaced. A few years back the carpet by the candles was removed and ceramic tiles laid to prevent fires. Next on their agenda is the carpeting in the church and in the hall. With the bumping and piling, it needs to be replaced to a safer type. So there is a meeting with a team working on a plan. We are asking the Knights and the CWG to spearhead this project and over the next year or so to raise money to get this done. Finally we removed the shower doors, in my bathroom, that were filled with moldy caulking and temporarily hung shower curtains. After the first shower I



decided I needed to get a grab bar to exit the tub safely. Of course I took some ribbing from my brothers. Being the oldest they are more than happy to remind me that in just over half a year I will be hitting the big 6-0. I just say that all that number means is I am smart enough to know what I need, and wise enough not to be worried about what the young ones are laughing at. Wow, the big 60 looks like it will unleash a whole new set of freedoms and I love the grab bar. *Fr. Roy*

Liturgy 101

The Roman Missal indicates that the faithful stand
together as a sign of unity with one another as the
Body of Christ during the communion rite. While
everyone processes to the altar, the vision of the
Church is that we remain standing. This posture is a
manifestation of the oneness in which we have
participated by the act of communion. It goes on to
offer the invitation, "if appropriate, during the
period of sacred silence after communion' they may
sit. This means that the place for private prayer or
devotion is this small period before the final prayer.
Any other time diminishes the sign of our unity. If
able, please remain standing during the communion
rite until everyone has come to the table.

FIRST COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION



Our parish family is looking forward to
seeing the many children, youth and their
parents, as we begin another year of
sacramental preparation. Every year we
are blessed by the enthusiasm and
energetic smiles of our young candidates

The Registration period is for the four weekends in the
month of September. **Registration Forms will be available
for pick up in the Parish office following any of the
Sunday masses, beginning the Aug 31/Sept.1 and
ending the Sept. 28/Sept. 29 .**

A copy of your child's **Baptismal certificate** must be
attached to the Registration form when you return the
completed form to the Parish office on Sunday.
Children in Grade 2 and Grade 7 are typically at the age to
prepare for their sacraments. If your child missed their
prep last year you may register this year.

It is very important to keep informed about all our program
information, meetings etc. The Parish Sunday bulletin is
our way of communicating with you and keeping you in-
formed. There will be an important Parent Information
Meeting in October. All parents will need to attend!

*Sunday is the Lord's day. It is and has always been a
"reasonable expectation" of the Church for all Catholic
people to share in the celebration of the Holy Mass every
Sunday. If Sunday Mass has not been apart of your weekly
routine, now is the time to make it the best part of your
Sunday.*
