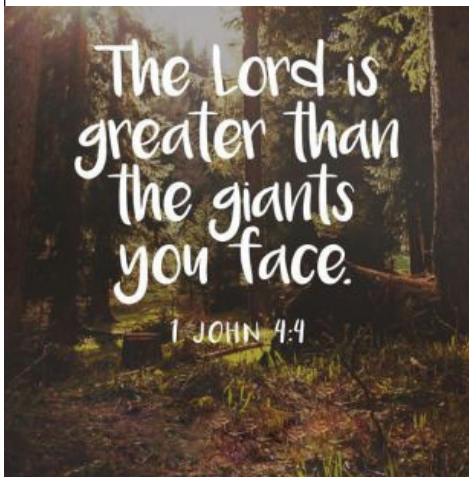

Ruminations...

I'm a fan of the full moons, and each one during the month has a name. The full moon which happened this Wednesday is called the Corn Moon as it usually corresponds with the corn harvest and signals the approach of the Fall. This year on the southeast side of the house I constructed a little garden. There is nothing like fresh tomatoes picked daily. It was always a great treat to pick big, juicy beefsteak tomatoes and have toasted tomato sandwiches with cheese, and mayo and bacon. We always had a big crop of them and for weeks we could eat them in a variety of ways until we got acid sores in our mouth. We also had great success with pumpkins. There was such a sense of accomplishment in carving a pumpkin for Hallowe'en that one had grown from the previous year's seeds. It was with great anticipation and excitement that once the soil was piled high that I set about planting my fare. I planted green onions, tomatoes and cherry tomatoes, beans, and peas, two blueberry bushes, corn, cantaloupe, and two varieties of pumpkins, a traditional orange variety and the newer ghost pumpkins, those neat looking white ones. Confidently I tended my little garden and watched as the green onion seeds sprouted followed by the pumpkins. I think I started salivating in anticipation of the harvest. Things started to slow down. The pumpkin vines never really developed and despite there being several flowers, not one has shown any interest in becoming my jack-o-lantern. The ghost variety just didn't sprout. The tomatoes seemed stunted and flowers only developed in numbers over the last couple of weeks, and the green onions, well, after 2 months look more like blades of grass than onion stalks. The six bean plants produces a grand total of 6 beans and there was certainly no giant at the end of those stalks, the peas, not a pea or a pod. I am sure that all my Irish farmer ancestors are rolling over in their graves. Maybe I should have included potatoes. My lone claim to fame is one cantaloupe that is about the size of five pin bowling ball but looks unlikely to ripen on the vine. I'm not sure what went wrong. Some people say the rainy weather stunted everything. Others claim the lack of heat slowed down everything. Every morning I peek out the window hoping beyond hope that something magically had happened over night, but alas... Anyway, all was not lost. There is still hope for the green onions and a few tomatoes, and of course the melon. The consolation prize was that this week, I opened the back door, went around to the garden and picked two ripe, albeit small tomatoes, washed them off, sliced them up, and ate them on delicious buns with mayo, cheese and bacon. It was small satisfaction, but it was satisfaction none the less. Time to plant next year's garlic. Here goes nothing.
