

Ruminations

With the arrival of autumn nigh upon us, as much as it is school routines, and sports routines, and the myriad of other obligations we take on, every year it seems my schedule includes the visits to the doctor, and the dentist and the optometrist. If the truth be known I sometimes schedule the dentist appointments in the mornings hoping that the visit gets pre-empted by the occurrence of a funeral. Nothing pleases me more than calling the dentist office and having to re-book several weeks or more later. I have already had to notifications from my eye doctor that it is that time of year. As a diabetic we should be getting our eyes tested yearly. Last year's visit precipitated a new set of glasses and honestly the selection of frames was very uninspiring and unimpressive. So for a whole year I have been mildly dissatisfied with my spectacles and with great envy I watch people leaving mass who have great looking frames. I kind of hope that my vision has declined enough to warrant new glasses so if I ask you where you got your frames, you will know why. My prescriptions for my diabetes needed to be re-prescribed by the doctor - it had been two years since I saw them last at the diabetes clinic and of course it was not an easy procedure, so I ended up going to the new walk in clinic just down the road beside Little Caesar's Pizza, (an maybe because I locate myself according to the pizza stores is part of the problem). After waiting an hour and a half the doctor asked me when my last bloodwork had been done. For me it should be done every three months or so but it had been two years. So she requisitioned a whole battery of tests. I walked down the hall to the Lifelabs and without nary minutes wait, I was ushered into a cubicle. I have bad experiences drawing blood. Apparently I have deep veins and whether it is at a clinic, or the hospital, both my arms get poked and pricked and squeezed trying to find a vein. I usually walk out with two or three bandaged needle pricks and the scorn to nurses who find me a professional challenge. This nurse tied the rubber band and tapped and tapped and bent my arm this way and that but she was reticent to jab the needle in. So she switched arms and went through the same routine - tap, tap, bend, stretch. Then in one quick poke bull's eye. She found the vein first try. If I didn't have a needle in my arm I would have applauded and hugged her. We don't often tip nurses, but I felt she



deserved it. But that all kind of vanished quickly as she unstrapped the band and handed me a little plastic bottle, directed me to the washroom and said good luck. It has been years and years since I had to provide a sample. I opted out of tipping her. Maybe next time.

Humanitarian Relief Flooding in Kerala, India

In late July, the state of Kerala, India was devastated by severe flooding due to unusually high rainfall during the monsoon season. Over 10,000 kms of roads have been wrecked and more than 20,000 homes destroyed. To date, over 300 people have died and more than 1 million people have been displaced and are living in relief camps, including more than 175,000 children under the age of 12.

In an effort to support people in Kerala who have been impacted by this disaster, the Archdiocese of Toronto is accepting funds that will be channelled through the Kerala Catholic Bishops' Council. Funds will be used initially to provide food, drinking water, clothes and medicine to people who have been displaced. In the long term, funds will be used for the reconstruction of communities.
