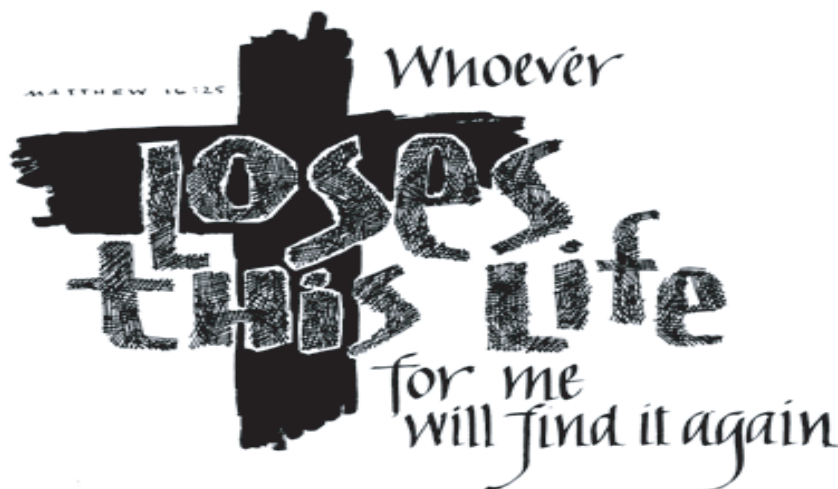

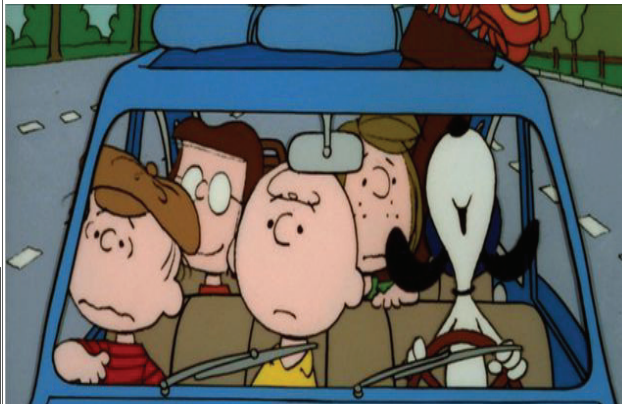

As dusk was setting in, I had to make it back to the residence and finally meet my roommate. That was the beginning of a great year. We got along great, he studying geology and I sports administration. He was a second year student and was more than happy to help this frosh navigate university life. That first week of orientation was a great gift to help settle nervous beginners. There were no cell phones or computers to keep in touch with home, so the phone booth was a busy place on Saturdays – the long distance charges were discounted then. So in my exuberance I got to hear the adventures of mom and dad's trip home. They had stopped at Frank Vetere's (a pizza place of old) and as they sat down, the music playing in the restaurant just happened to be Barbara Streisand singing 'Memories' or more properly "The way we were". Apparently mom had a flood of tears and was caught laughing and crying all in one. So for all the students who



have headed out, to all the parents who have one less in the nest, to all our students embarking on the next leg of their education in life, enjoy these blessed times. They are gift. *Fr. Roy*
