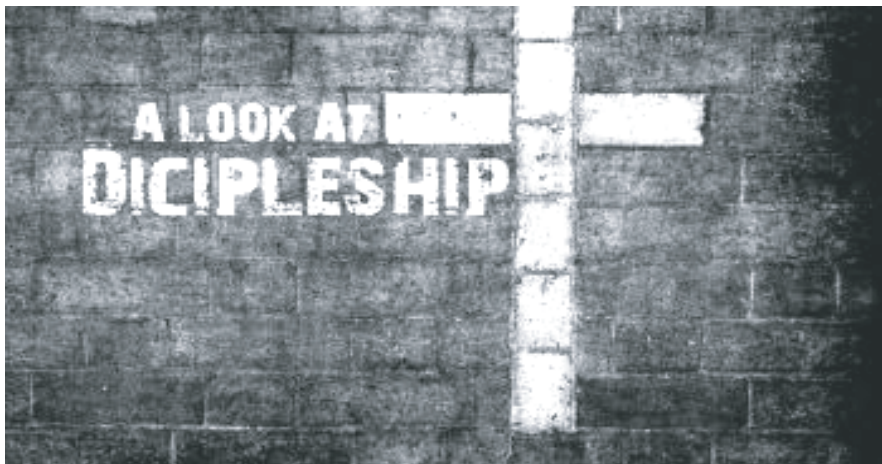

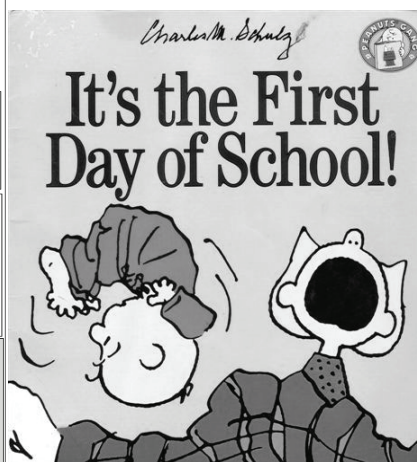

Being somewhat of a numbers nerd, crazy calculations can fill my head, as if you haven't already noticed with the number of hours remaining before the start of school. One of those calculations actually scared the be-jeebers out of me. I realized that next September will mark the exact half way mark from my last first day of elementary school (grade 8), and my hundredth birthday. It will be equal distance, and that means the year after, I will be closer to 100 years of age than the first day of grade 8. No wonder the memories of this momentous and exciting time are dimming. Not only can I claim that the passage of time is obscuring the recollections, but the memory isn't what it used to be either. I loved the start of school. There was never any hesitation or remorse about the end of summer and the start of school. It wasn't because summers were boring. Despite the fact there were no computers, Nintendos, iPods, video games or even cable television, there was always something to do and someone to do it with. There was biking and hiking and the ever occupied play lot across the road where football, soccer, red rover, tag, hide and seek, tree climbing, sand pile activities etc. were always on the go. Within a hundred yards of the house, there were more things to do and more people available than anyone really needed. It wasn't about seeing friends we had missed all summer, because most of them were part of life anyway. It was because I simply loved learning. I can't recall any subject in particular that I didn't appreciate and love, except maybe the annual writing assignment about "how we spent our summer". Being bus students, we always arrived with plenty of time before school to play. The schoolyard was divided between girls' side and boys' side. On the girls side, the young boys were able to go if they were grade two or younger. Girls were allowed on the boys' side but they were not allowed to complain if they got hurt in the roughhousing that went on. There was lots of room to romp and play. The first day back also meant that the field had just been cut leaving all kinds of dried straw that was piled into forts. When the first bell sounded, everyone had to go to their lineup, boys to the boys' side and girls' and grade ones and twos to the girls' side. Lunch pails held the spot and the lines were in ascending order from youngest closest to the doors and the oldest the furthest. The teacher on duty had to ensure that the lines were straight and everyone was settled. Then we filed in walking silently along the wall in single file, and stopping on the stairs if a teacher were ascending or descending. We entered the new classroom for the first time and looked for our names on the desk that had been assigned to us, complete with pencils, erasers, rulers, and notebooks duly piled on top all ready for the new year. Ah the simplicity and excitement of it all. It is a time of hope and promise. It was the most wonderful time of the year. Happy first day of school, whether it is your first, or a distant memory. *Fr. Roy*
