

### Ruminations ....

With the commencement of school, classroom topics will at some time or other turn to what "I did this summer." Back in my elementary days it was kind of a pat routine each year with little variance. It was baseball, lacrosse, a week out at the farm and lots of hanging outside from breakfast to sundown. Hanging involved riding bikes, climbing trees, or playing with the built in menagerie of neighbourhood kids that was always available, especially with the family that had 12 kids and the one that had 9. Our family of four boys seemed rather deficient by comparison, but it worked for us. Now on some of the days, it was nothing more than being bored and lazing outside in the shade. This was in the days before air conditioners and it is also before the time of cable television. We were stuck with two channels, neither of which had any programming appeal. The television was hardly ever on anyway. The houses that had the magic of oscillating fans became the central hub. It is so hard to imagine life without air conditioning and I sometimes wonder how we ever survived. The year we went to the C.N.E. was the only blip in an otherwise standard summer routine. If one were to ask me what I did this summer, "as little as possible". It was a great time to catch one's breath, however all my plans for a great load of outside work had to be curtailed – much of the time when I had opportunity it was just too hot to get involved in something that could be put off to a cooler day or next year. On those occasions when the weather did permit, it was incredibly therapeutic to lop down branches and dig up stumps. I had some inspirational meetings in planning for parish directions, re-visioning parish, and working to create a plan of action for parish growth. Much of this was the result of the parish survey a couple of years back, and we have still been working with the Catholic Leadership Institute in forging a solid direction. One thing I did notice about this summer was the merciful absence of a lot of mosquitoes. As the sun was setting, I would head out for a walk around the block, and the only wildlife I encountered were a couple of skunks, a few rabbits, two cats, and one hawk in a fir tree. That came to mind only because I am feverishly scratching my first mosquito bite as I write this piece. Reminiscing is a pleasant enough exercise that hopefully evokes a sense of thanksgiving, but it is also to direct us forward to all the possibilities and adventures that lie before us. The memories of the past anchor us for when the



challenges unsettle us. So let us begin this new chapter, with stalwart hearts, open minds, and courageous twinkle in our eye to enter into the adventures we call life. And away we go! *Fr. Roy*

### Humanitarian Relief Flooding in Kerala, India

In late July, the state of Kerala, India was devastated by severe flooding due to unusually high rainfall during the monsoon season. Over 10,000 kms of roads have been wrecked and more than 20,000 homes destroyed. To date, over 300 people have died and more than 1 million people have been displaced and are living in relief camps, including more than 175,000 children under the age of 12.

In an effort to support people in Kerala who have been impacted by this disaster, the Archdiocese of Toronto is accepting funds that will be channelled through the Kerala Catholic Bishops' Council. Funds will be used initially to provide food, drinking water, clothes and medicine to people who have been displaced. In the long term, funds will be used for the reconstruction of communities.


