



But when the scribes and Pharisees continued asking him, Jesus straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." (Jn 8:7)

There are many things Jesus is not saying through his actions or words in the story about the adulteress. He was not saying that unless you're perfect, you had better not try to judge anything at all. He wasn't saying that. I have to judge right and wrong. Jesus wasn't saying that there is no difference between right and wrong. Nor was he saying that I should be compromising in my attitude toward sin. Both Jesus and the Pharisees thought that what the woman did was wrong. They both agreed it was sinful.

The difference will be in the way they deal with the sinner. The Pharisees were pitiless and cruel with the woman accused of adultery ("they made her stand there in front of everyone"). They were trying to use her as a lesson for everyone else. Jesus' interest was to *help* the woman caught in adultery. He wanted to make her whole. He wanted to redeem her. That doesn't mean he was soft on sin. He was simply treating her with love.

The Lord treats me as he treated this woman. He never simply condemns me. Despite the worst I've done, the Lord never stops loving me.

Maybe I can think about the people I'd like to condemn...and say a prayer for them.

<u>Development and Peace-Share Lent 2013 Human Dignity-</u> More than Ever

Human dignity is the right to live on your own land. The Phnong indigenous community in the Cambodian village of Gati has long lived in insecurity. As an ethnic minority, Phnong community members have few rights, and live in fear of being pushed off their land and losing their traditional way of life. They are concerned over land conflicts in the area and the arrival of a mining company that recently came and dug holes around the community, laying claim over land that has traditionally been used by resin tappers. More than ever, the need for legal recognition feels urgent for the community. "When we get a legal identity certificate, we can be the legal owners of our land and we will no longer be afraid of losing it," said Mr. Khum Peak, the chairperson of the Phnong Indigenous Community in Gati. D & P partner, DEVELOPMENT AND PARTNERSHIP IN ACTION (DPA), is working with families in the village to help them apply for legal identity certificates, which will then facilitate the process of registering for communal land titling certificates. "When villagers have legal identity certificates, they are able to prove their ownership in the case of land encroachment and land conflict with mining companies," said Mr. Peak. It will also minimize existing problems, such as large-scale illegal land trading, village boundary conflicts and the migration of people from outside areas. "With a legal identity certificate, I can legally transfer my land to my children," said Mr. Peak who has 2.5 hectares of land for farming and rice cultivation. With this certificate, he knows that his children will not have to live with the same injustices that he did. TODAY IS SOLIDARITY SUNDAY!
