From Father's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

We celebrate Remembrance Day and remember the gift of life and the sacrifices of our veterans throughout the years to protect our freedom and the freedom of others in other nations. In their own way, they too imitate the sacrificial

love of Christ who gave Himself for us and our freedom from a life of slavery to sin. It is worthwhile and important to give thanks and remember them in our prayers.

In another way, we traditionally remember all who have died during the month of November. We will have a Book of Remembrance at the back of the church in the foyer. You are welcome to put in the name of any deceased person you wish for us as a community to pray for, whether they are Catholic or Christian or not of any religion. We will have a Mass offered before the end of November to celebrate and remember all the deceased as a parish.

Lastly, I just wanted to touch on Masses and Mass intentions. In terms of announcing intentions, we only announce the weekend ones before the Mass begins. During the weekday Masses I will generally mention the intention in the prayers of the faithful, unless someone else has already prayed for that intention, as well as the eucharistic prayer. On the weekends though, as for many it is the only Mass they get to, I do not mention the names of people during the Mass in the prayers of the faithful or the eucharistic prayer so that we do not forget that Mass is a 'community' event and belongs to the whole community so in fairness, it is really everyone's Mass not just the person who makes a public offering for an intention. When someone offers a Mass intention, it means it is the primary intention I pray for at that Mass; however, the fruits of the Mass are still open to all and the Lord seeks to listen to all our needs and intentions. I do ask forgiveness and understanding, when by accident or being overwhelmed with many things at the same time that we forget to announce the name or intention as it is not intentional. We have many openings these days for Masses on the weekdays--when you see a blank spot in the bulletin it means that there is no assigned intention for that Mass. Masses can be offered for the living or deceased and for those Catholic or not. Many look for a weekend intention, please know that it is good to call in advance as these fill up quickly. Also, by church law, one Mass every weekend must be offered up for the intentions of all parishioners. We rotate that Mass on purpose to ensure everyone gets the opportunity to experience that reality. There are only two times of year where I do not take any personal intentions--Christmas Eve and Day, as well as Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday, to respect the equality of our parish family. The standard offering is \$10, as set by the archdiocese. However, no Mass intention will ever be refused if one can't afford to give an offering. Also, one can give more or less than the suggested amount, depending on their abilities or wishes.
