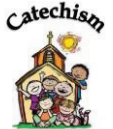

Mass Intentions

Questions have been raised again surrounding the offering of Masses. I wish to clarify those for our community. First of all, Masses can be offered for any reasonable intention that is in line with God's will for those living or those deceased, whether Catholic, Christian or not. The tradition of Masses being offered for the deceased go back to the times of the early church. The Mass is considered the best and highest form of intercessory prayer that can be offered for someone living or deceased. The tradition of making an offering for the Mass is related to the idea of a person giving up something of their own to parallel Christ's giving of Himself on the Cross. The offering is given to the priest and may be used by him for his personal needs/upkeep or for charitable causes at his discretion. In the province of Manitoba, the suggested offering that was determined by the bishops of Manitoba was \$10. This is a suggested offering as a person can give less or more if they so desire according to their means and no Mass intention would be refused if someone couldn't make an offering. It should be understood that when a person offers a Mass, the Mass is not theirs alone, for the Mass has infinite grace and value; therefore, all can offer their own personal intentions at the Mass anytime for any need apart from making a formal offering. A priest though has an obligation to say that Mass or have that Mass said once it is accepted. If a priest has too many Masses to be said, they can be passed on to the missions or other priests in need or the diocese where a priest is from. Priests are generally not allowed to have more than one intention at Mass; likewise, if a priest has more than one regular Mass (excluding funerals/weddings which are considered special occasions), the priest can only take one paid intention per day. When it occurs from time to time that I have more than one Mass on a day with a stipend, the extra money goes to the Vocation Fund of the Archdiocese, which helps to pay towards the training of future priests. It is also church law that one of the Masses every weekend must be offered for the intentions of all parishioners to ensure that people always have an opportunity to have the priest intercede for their own needs on a weekly basis. This is why not all weekend Masses are available. I try to rotate the Mass for all parishioners to make it fair to the entire community. The only time of year where I do not accept Mass intentions are **Christmas** and **Easter**, so as to avoid jealousy and division amongst parishioners since at **Christmas** and **Easter** many more people come who do not always come to church. I do attempt to be fair and balanced with regards to the scheduling and saying of the Masses that are requested as much as possible. I hope that this will be helpful for those who have been asking.
