# Advent

# The Days of Advent

#### St. Pope John Paul II, Dec. 18, 2002

Pope John Paul II in his address on Dec. 18, 2002 said, "The liturgy of Advent...helps us to understand fully the value and meaning of the mystery of Christmas. It is not just about commemorating the historical event, which occurred some 2,000 years ago in a little village of Judea. Instead, it is necessary to understand that the whole of our life must be an 'advent,' a vigilant awaiting of the final coming of Christ. To predispose our mind to welcome the Lord who, as we say in the Creed, one day will come to judge the living and the dead, we must learn to recognize Him as present in the events of daily life. Therefore, Advent is, so to speak, an intense training that directs us decisively toward Him who already came, who will come, and who comes continuously."

# What is the origin of the Crèche (Nativity Scene)?

The story of the origin of the Christmas crèche rests with the very holy man, St. Francis of Assisi.

In the year 1223, St. Francis, a deacon, was visiting the town of Grecio to celebrate Christmas. St. Francis realized that the chapel of the Franciscan hermitage would be too small to hold the congregation for Midnight Mass. So he

found a niche in the rock near the town square and set up the altar. This Midnight Mass would be very special; unlike any other Midnight Mass. St. Francis was determined to celebrate it with all possible solemnity. He prepared a manger, and brought hay, and an ox and a donkey to the appointed place. The brethren were summoned; the people ran together, the forest resounded with their voices. That venerable night was made glorious with brilliant lights and psalms of praise. St. Francis stood before the manger, full of devotion and piety. Then he preached to the people about the nativity of the poor King, the Babe of Bethlehem. Our own Nativity scenes are a visible reminder of that night when our Savior was born. May we never forget to see in our hearts the little Babe of Bethlehem, who came to save us from sin. We must never forget that the wood of the manger that held Him so securely would one day give way to the wood of the cross. May we too, like St. Francis, embrace Him with all of our love.

Did you know that Bethlehem means house of bread? Jesus was laid in a manger, the trough from which the animals were fed. What a symbol! Jesus is the Bread of Life. When we receive the Eucharist, the true Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ, we too are fed. Jesus is our true food. He is sustenance for our souls. When the Eucharist is received with reverence and in a state of grace, the soul becomes nourished and transformed.

# CATECHISM CORNER

#### 43. How do our guardian angels help us?

Our guardian angels help us by praying for us, by protecting us from harm, and by inspiring us to do good.

# 44. What happened to the angels who did not remain faithful to God?

The angels who did not remain faithful to God were cast into hell, and these are called bad angels, or devils.

Depart from me, accursed ones, into the everlasting fire which was prepared for the devil and his angels. (Matthew 25:41)

# 45. What is the chief way in which the bad angels try to harm us?

The chief way in which the bad angels try to harm us is by tempting us to sin.

Put on the armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. (Ephesians 6:11)

46. Do all temptations come from the bad angels?

Some temptations come from the bad angels; but other temptations come from ourselves and from the persons and things about us.

Do not love the world, or the things that are in the world. (I John 2:15)

#### 47. Can we always resist temptations?

We can always resist temptations, because no temptation can force us into sin, and because God will always help us if we ask Him.

And he has said to me, "My grace is sufficient for thee." (I Corinthians 12:9)

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
