NOVEMBER MONTH OF THE SOULS

What is "Purgatory"? The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches:

All who die in God's grace, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo <u>purification</u>, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven (1030).

You won't find the word Purgatory in the Bible. This name was given by the Church to refer to that state of cleansing or purgation that takes place after death.

Scripture is very clear when it says, "But nothing unclean shall enter [heaven]" (Rev. 21:27). Hab. 1:13 says, "You [God]... are of purer eyes than to behold evil and cannot look on wrong..." How many of us will be perfectly sanctified at the time of our deaths? Most of us will be in need of further purification in order to enter the gates of heaven after we die, if, please God, we die in a state of grace. I Corinthians 3:11-15 may well be the most straightforward text in all of Sacred Scripture when it comes to Purgatory: For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if any one builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble-each man's work will become manifest; for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. If the work which any man has built on the foundation survives. he will receive a reward. If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire.

What is being referred to cannot be heaven because there are imperfections that need to be "burned up" (see again, Rev. 21:27, Hab. 1:13). It cannot be hell because souls are being saved. So what is it? We Catholics simply specify the part of the judgment of the saved where imperfections are purged as "Purgatory."

We have the duty and the honor of praying throughout the year for the souls in Purgatory. These Souls can pray for us but they cannot pray for themselves. They need our prayers. We say the church is made up of three groups: the Church Triumphant who are the saints in heaven. The Church Militant which refers to us fighting the good fight against evil on earth. The Church Suffering that is made up of the Suffering souls in Purgatory. Please remember to

pray for all the Suffering Souls in a special way throughout the month of November.

Eternal Rest

This is one of the most commonly recited of Catholic prayers for the suffering souls. Through our prayers, we can help the faithful departed during their time in Purgatory, so that they can enter more quickly into the fullness of Heaven.

Eternal Rest Prayer

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let Your perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Pilgrimage travelers

Are you going on a Catholic pilgrimage? Did you know that there is a strict dress code for entering churches and shrines? If you are dressed inappropriately, you will not be permitted to enter. This is a reminder that the Catholic Church, like our very own parish church, is Holy Ground. When we enter a Catholic Church, we are standing before God. How would I present myself for an audience with the Prime Minister, the Queen, the Pope? How therefore should I dress before God? Short skirts, bare backs, sleeveless tops, shorts, tight pants, form fitting dresses and tops, are not permitted. Clothing should never draw attention to one's body. This is considered immodest and in bad taste. No drinks or gum chewing are allowed. Be aware that there are persons at the Church entrances who do monitor the visitors. Do not be disappointed. You will be turned away if you do not abide by the regulations. Dress appropriately at all times for Masses and Church wherever you happen to be. Respecting the dress code will ensure a pleasant trip.
