NOVEMBER 15

Memorial Day of St. Albert the Great

The saint and doctor of the Church who would be known as Albertus Magnus was born sometime before the year 1200.

Sometime around the year 1223, Albert experienced an encounter with the Blessed Virgin Mary. This encounter moved him so much that he chose to become a member of the Dominican Order. He thereafter studied theology.

In 1259, Albert participated in the General Chapter of the Dominicans along with Thomas Aquinas and several other contemporary leaders of the Order. They created a program of study for the Dominican order and developed a curriculum for philosophy. From this course of study would later arise the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas, in Rome. Today, the university which is known as the "Angelicum," is one of the

foremost theological colleges in the world. It is still run by the Dominican order. Before his death, he mourned the early passing of his great student, Thomas Aquinas, who would later be recognized as a saint and doctor of the Church. Aquinas died in 1274. Albert spent his last years defending the work of Aquinas which is among the most important work in the Church.



During his life, Albert wrote

thirty-eight volumes covering topics ranging from philosophy to geography, astronomy, law, friendship, and love.

"Banish, therefore, from thy heart the distractions of earth and turn thine eyes to spiritual joys, that thou mayest learn at last to repose in the light of the contemplation of God." Albertus Magnus
