NEW YEAR GREETINGS FROM DEACON MIKE

Is it just me or does it seem like the New Year has come suddenly even though we are so ready to

assign 2020 to the historical refuse dump? Like most New Years', last New Year was full of anticipation and expectation. It cannot be overstated, 2020 turned out very differently from what we imagined! New Year is a time for looking back and for looking forward: an opportunity for reflecting on what we did well or not so well and for making changes. Usually, this process for is relatively straight forward for many of us; however, our experiences of last year have made this process more complicated and the demarcation between 2020 and 2021 has become very blurred and dark. How can we as Christians, as Catholics, respond to this situation?

Last weekend we celebrated the Solemnity of the Epiphany of Our Lord. From Matthew 's Gospel we recall "Wise Men from the East" had observed a great and spectacular light ascending in the heavens which the travellers identified as an anticipated sign of the birth of "King of the Jews" and were searching for the infant king in order to worship Him with precious gifts. The Wise Men designated the magnificent light as "His Star" i.e., the Star of King Jesus. The first reading is taken from Isaiah the great prophet of Israel who declared "Arise, shine for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you! For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples: but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light and kings to the brightness of your dawn." The glory of God burst upon the Earth, upon ancient Israel, when "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us". As promised in the Old Testament Scriptures, Nations and Kingdoms of the world, as exemplified and foreshadowed by the Wise Men, have been drawn to this great light, His Star, and which has, and is, and will continue to banish the powers darkness; all that is contrary and obstructive to the perfect will of God.

This is a message of great hope and anticipation centred on God's infinite Love which was incarnated or embodied by Jesus Christ. As I write this, I am reminded that when I was a child, I had an intense and crippling fear of the dark. At some point, I asked the Lord Jesus to help me overcome this fear and deliberately walked around in pitch black places whilst placing my trust in the Lord and reached a point of no longer being afraid of the dark. In a very

real sense by focussing on the light and love of Christ, even at this young age, the darkness of this phobia was dispelled once and for all.

Even though we are going through an uncertain dark time this New Year it is vital that, like the Wise Men, we look up to the heavens and focus on the spectacular light of our loving Creator. This attentive action allows God's light to shine upon us, perhaps in our devotional prayer or meditating on God's Word, as we place our hope and trust in Him. Whilst basking in God's warm loving light, the darkness that surrounds us scatters. Thus, the reflected light of God's love and glory shines upon others in dark places. In the canticle of Zechariah (the Benedictus) which comes from Luke Gospel Chapter 1, and is recited in the morning prayer of the Divine Office, declares:

"In the tender compassion of our Lord The dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness And the shadow of death, And to guide our feet into the way of peace."

On behalf of Fr. Love, Rosanne, my wife Mary and myself, I wish you a joyous, peaceful and mightily blessed New Year!
