STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Join us Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m. for Stations of the Cross followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and concluding with Benediction around 8:30 p.m.

THE FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH: On Saturday, March **19th** we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the patron of Canada and the patron of the Universal Church. Join us as we pray for St. Joseph's protection for our country and for the Church. We will have Mass at 8:30 a.m. All are welcome.

LENTEN BIBLE STUDY: By the Paschal mystery, the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ we are saved. The narrative of each of the Gospels leads us to that moment at which Jesus gives his life for the salvation of the world. On Palm Sunday each year we listen to one of the Passion accounts from one of the synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke, and each year on Good Friday we listen to the Gospel according to John. Join us on March 19 and 26 as Father Ed will lead us through an examination of the Passion narratives. We will begin with Mass at 8:30 a.m. followed by the talk in the parish hall.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION: Friday, March 25th is the Solemnity of the Annunciation. Instead of Stations of the Cross we will offer Mass at 7 p.m. that evening. The Mass will be offered for the respect for life and the protection of the unborn child.
