LENTEN BIBLE STUDY: By the Paschal mystery, the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ we are saved. The narrative of each of the Gospels leads us to that moment at which Jesus gives his life for the salvation of the world. On Palm Sunday each year we listen to one of the Passion accounts from one of the synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke, and each year on Good Friday we listen to the Gospel according to John. Join us on March 12, **19, and 26** as Father Ed will lead us through an examination of the Passion narratives from each of the Gospels. We will begin with Mass at 8:30 a.m. followed by the talk in the parish hall. A special invitation for Mass on Saturday, March 19 which is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the patron of Canada and the Universal Church.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: Join us Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m. for Stations of the Cross followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and concluding with Benediction around 8:30 p.m.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION: Friday, March 25th is the Solemnity of the Annunciation. This feast, nine months before Christmas, marks the Angel Gabriel's announcement to the Virgin Mary that she would become the Mother of God. Instead of Stations of the Cross we will offer Mass at 7 p.m. that evening. The Mass will be offered for the respect for life and the protection of the unborn child.

PARENTING TIP OF THE MONTH: Lent is a time of reflection for all Catholics and a perfect season to help children understand why we engage in prayer, works of charity, care for all and

practicing self-control, since all of these can bring us closer to God. Spend time on your Lenten journey as a family by attending Mass and discussing, in simple language, the readings you hear. Decide as a family on prayers and reflections to engage in each day of Lent and together look at how your family might use their resources to give to others. Your children can bring hope to the hearts of others during Lent and their spiritual journey will be enhanced by your presence and guidance.

MARRIAGE TIP OF THE MONTH: The season of Lent is a perfect time to reflect on how we are living our lives according to God's call to discipleship and vocation. The vocation of marriage is an essential call since the Sacrament of Marriage is meant to be the visible sign or God's invisible love to the world. Lent then, is a perfect time to examine what you are bringing to your vocation, to see if forgiveness is readily available when needed and to contemplate whether you might make changes to better fulfill your call to marriage. As well, consider praying with your spouse, reflecting on a short Bible passage daily and working on holding anger during Lent, since all of these will strengthen your bond of love and bring you feelings of joy as the Easter season draws near.
