In his prayer intention for the month of October, Pope Francis call us to "*pray that by the virtue of baptism, the laity, especially women, may participate more in areas of responsibility in the Church.*"

Today, it is especially necessary to create broader opportunities for a more incisive female presence in the Church. And we must emphasize the feminine lay presence because women tend to be left aside. We must promote the integration of women, especially where important decisions are made.
