Beatification of Father McGivney will take place. Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in the basement of St. Mary Church, New Haven Connecticut on March 29, 1882. The founder of the Knights of Columbus, Father Michael J. McGivney was a central figure in the growth of Catholicism in America, and he remains a model today. His example of charity, evangelization and empowerment of the laity continues to bear fruit and guide Knights of Columbus around the world.
