INDULGENCES FOR SOULS IN PURGATORY:

November 1 – 8: You can obtain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the souls in purgatory if you devoutly visit a cemetery and, at least mentally, pray for the departed. **On All Soul's Day** (Nov. 2): You can receive a plenary indulgence for the souls in purgatory, if you devoutly visit a church or oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed. In addition, all indulgences require offering prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father, going to Confession (about 20 days either before or after) and the reception of Holy Communion.



BOOK OF LIFE: During the month of November, we pray in a special way for the faithful departed. The names of our deceased loved ones can be inscribed in the Book of Life. The Book will be

located in the Church Hall over the next couple of weeks. Stop by and inscribe the names of your loved ones. On November 1st it will be moved into the church near the altar.



ALL SOULS DAY MASS

On **Tuesday, November 2nd** there will be two Masses: 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. At the 7 p.m. Mass we will pray in a special way for those whose funerals

were celebrated in our parish this past year. (Adoration will begin immediately after the 8:00 a.m. Mass and will conclude with benediction at 6:30 p.m. as normal.)

ENTERING INTO THE SPIRIT OF ADVENT:

Join us on Saturday mornings (November 27, December 4, and December 11) for a time of prayer and reflection. There will be a Mass at 8:30 a.m. followed by a talk in the parish hall at 9:00 a.m. (Father Ed will lead a discussion on the Gospel accounts of the Christmas story) Following the discussion, we will return to the Church for Eucharistic adoration concluding with Benediction at 10:30 a.m. All are welcome.
