#### Happy Easter to my brothers and sisters in the Risen Lord!

The cross is the way, the resurrection of Christ is the victory. As Jesus' fidelity to His Father in heaven through His saving cross was rewarded by a resurrection, so will our fidelity to God's will be rewarded by a like resurrection.

The resurrection of the body is not to be understood in a figurative or metaphorical way. It is real, it is factual, it is concrete. On the last day, when the trumpet sounds, all the dead shall be raised and go before the judgement seat of God. The righteous shall share in the resurrection to glory – the unrepentant to the resurrection of the damned. Need we really know the latter part of the adage? Absolutely, yes. Why so? Because God respects our freedom. It is part of His love. The freedom we have and remember as Canadians every Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> is not an heirloom, but a sacred trust that must continually be understood, treasured and worked at. Freedom came at a price, and is never to be taken for granted. In an even more profound way, the freedom won by the death of the God-Man is a divine gift that is to be accepted in faith and translated into goodness and holiness. The good news is that we have been saved through the blood of the Lamb and we, through baptism and divine grace, become recipients of God's redeeming work. Our sacred duty, knowing the whole truth and nothing but the truth, includes helping others to Christ, and continually proclaiming Him before all. Cardinal Collins recently said in a homily, that the Good News of the Gospel is both victory in Christ and the responsibility to proclaim with clarity and charity the whole truth. It is our obligation in love.

During the Easter season which lasts until Pentecost Sunday, we will hear readings at Mass about Christian hope. Come to Mass as often as you can during this season to receive the body of the Risen Lord. His grace will keep us close to him. Pray for loved ones and others who may have drifted from God. Divine Mercy Sunday is next weekend. The chaplet will be prayed at 3:00 pm. It is a beautiful opportunity to do a resurrection thing – pray for the souls of others.

Finally, I wish to thank all who worked so hard to prepare for Easter so that we may be lifted up – our choirs, servers, readers, Eucharistic ministers and all who minister to their brothers and sisters in faith.

One more 'finally' ... Congratulations to Tanya Martin and Brittany Baker who were received into the fullness of the faith at the Easter Vigil. You are now as Catholic as the Holy Father himself. Be assured that you, too, will have to share in the cross of Jesus by dying to sin every day. In doing so, you will live a life more glorious and more fulfilling than you could have imagined.

May we all one day share in the mighty company of Holy Mary, Mother of the Church, St. Joseph, St. Mark and all the saints who help us from their place in heaven.

#### **BISHOP'S MESSAGE FOR EASTER 2015**

Dear friends in Christ:

At the beginning of our 40 day Lenten journey, we were marked with ashes in the Sign of the Cross – a stark reminder that we are going to die, all of us, sooner or later. Now, at the Easter celebrations, those ashes are washed away when we are "soaked" with the same Easter water with which The Elect are baptized! Death no longer has a claim on us. We know that God has the last word and God's word for us is the same as His word for Jesus, who was crucified, died and laid in the tomb. LIVE! And so we do: WE LIVE - IN HIM!

WE LIVE! WE LIVE IN HIM! And that is what we celebrate this Easter and every Easter! It is why we "pull out all the stops" - the Easter fire, the huge Easter candle (Christ our light!), the many Scripture readings that point us to LIFE, the Easter water (Baptism – new life), the incense, the bells, the flowers – all of our senses are inundated because this message is so very important! BECAUSE HE LIVES – WE LIVE! WE LIVE FULLY NOW, and we enjoy the blessed promise that WE WILL LIVE ETERNALLY WITH HIM THEN! This is the hope that keeps us focused every day.

So, how do we choose to live? Like Him, we choose to live *for* others; that is the ideal toward which we strive each day, every day, one day at a time! It is what our Lenten discipline has helped us practice. It is expressed in the many small sacrifices we accepted, culminating, perhaps, in our Share Lent offering which supports the unknown poor in faraway places, waiting, longing for, our solidarity and support!

Together now, united in Him, we set out on 50 days of joyous Easter celebration – celebrating LIFE and self-giving LOVE. During these days, our FAITH in Jesus Christ can deepen, our HOPE in the fullness of life with Him can become ever more convinced, and our LOVE for one another, especially those in particular need, can increase!


