Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.



3. On the 10 Hail Mary Beads say the following: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

(Repeat step 2 and 3 for all five decades).

4. Conclude with (three times): Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Divine Mercy and Truth

Judge Ito (the judge in the trial of O.J. Simpson) called me up the other day. He told me that he was going to grant me clemency or mercy. I told him 'no thanks.' I didn't do anything that required mercy from his court.

Of course, I made up the above. How ridiculous to accept mercy when I had no need for it – not from his seat of judgement, anyway.

I fear, on the other hand, that many look at their need for Divine mercy much in the same way as I disregarded the fictitious offer of mercy from Judge Ito (Why? I didn't do anything wrong!).

Mercy can only be appreciated when one realizes their great need for mercy. Certainly, we all need God's mercy, but that need will not be accepted unless one realizes the truth of their own sinfulness – mercy and truth must go hand in hand.

I take a look at what has taken place in the last fifty years or so – and now the prospect of legalizing the killing of the infirmed ... I cringe during our national anthem when we sing "God keep our land," while knowing the status of God's law in this land. One day I hope we will see the need to fall down on our collective knees and beg for mercy. God's mercy is always there in spades, waiting for us to admit the truth.
