

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Annulments...

Dear People of God,

Still, people are confused on the whole matter of annulments. Only the other day, I was asked, "why does a divorced non-catholic need an annulment if they wish to re-marry with a Catholic?"

The simplest answer is that marriages between non-catholics are just as valid as those celebrated in the Catholic Church. Even non-baptized or non-religious people are bound by the Creator's mandate that no man shall divide what God has joined. Long before there was marriage as a sacrament, there existed marriage in the natural order, which too was established by God Himself. God's law is binding for all — believer and non-believer alike.

So what is an annulment? Is it not just a euphemism for Catholic divorce? I can see how some may think this way, but it is not the case. Annulments are declarations that there really was no marriage (in the truest sense of the word) right from the get-go, right from the time the wedding took place.

Some of the grounds for declaring a marriage null are as follows: the marriage was not or could not be consummated; entering a marriage due to force or fear; the lack of capability to enter marriage validly due to serious 'psychic' or psychological reasons. The grounds for declaring a marriage null and void must be established beyond a reasonable doubt by those well trained in the theology of marriage and church law.

Can a divorced Catholic receive Holy Communion? Yes, so long as they have not entered another marriage outside the Church. Sometimes a civil divorce is necessary to legally divide assets in irreconcilable situations. Still, the law of God is binding — they are married in God's eyes and bound to marital fidelity. As one outstanding Catholic woman said to me: "I'll be faithful to the 'worse' part of our marriage vows because I promised to, and I'll be there to forgive should he decide to come back." This is possible only by divine grace.

Can a divorced Catholic person living in a marriage outside the Church ever receive the Eucharist again? Marriage is an exclusive "two in one flesh" union. Unless a spouse dies, or a previous marriage has been annulled, a second "two in one flesh" cannot be entered into. No Catholic, therefore, can receive the Eucharist while they are violating this law. Only a month and a half ago, I anointed, confessed, and gave the Eucharist to a lady who had lived with another man for thirty years. She never went to communion during this time — rightly so. However, at the time of her approaching death, and with no possibility of further breaking the vows to her first husband, she made her peace with God. Happily, the Church could open the doors for this humble, repentant lady whose earthly life was coming to an end.

Finally, we should not judge those who, through human weakness and sinfulness, have drifted from the Church's teaching on marriage. God knows that, in some way or another, we have all failed Him. Yet, we must uphold the Lord's teaching – we do not believe in divorce.

How can we better prepare our youth for marriage, or priesthood, or religious life? I can give some thoughts on this in a future bulletin...

Modesty... (from other parish bulletins)

This is the virtue that flows from two Cardinal virtues – Temperance and Charity.

Temperance moderates the senses, the appetites and the emotions. As we grow older (childhood to adolescence and beyond) we cover up more and more in public to avoid drawing excessive attention to ourselves and provoking responses in others that can cause them to devour and consume another's beauty as opposed to just appreciate it. When going out in public ask: "will my manner of dress cause another to stare and even (bottom line) possibly cause another to sin?"

Modesty is respect for self (I am not an object to be glared at) and others, so that I may not be a source of undue distraction to them. Modesty at home with the family will differ somewhat from how it is displayed at church, funeral homes, and sporting events. The big question is: what effect am I trying to create? There is nothing wrong with looking beautiful or handsome. Seductive, hot-to-trot, is not the norm for a Christian who wishes to be (even in their physical demeanor) a light to others.

St. Paul said to <u>women</u>: "Cover yourselves (i.e. your beauty) for the sake of the angels."
