# A Christmas Message from Fr. Don...

There is a love for the Eucharist, Mary, the poor, the Word of God, and there is the desire to grow in goodness and holiness. This is very evident to me.

I commend all of you in your efforts to be humble and faithful servants of the Lord. Deacon Basil is a great asset to all of us. Speaking for myself, I am deeply appreciative of his good work here, particularly for his preaching, teaching, witnessing and assistance at the altar of God at Holy Mass. As well, I am deeply indebted to Pam for her excellent service to the parish and to myself. As well, I cannot forget to mention Beth because she makes sure I am fed and live in a clean house. That would not be the case if she were not here.

Lastly, pray before the Lord in the chapel and let Him speak to you. This will lead all of us to the confessional and in turn to the mercy, grace and peace of the Lord.

If we believe that He was born in a stable – then we must believe He is present on the altar at every CHRISTmas – a miracle in our very midst.
