Movie Mondays

December 14th at 10:00 a.m. we will present our final feature film for this year: *The Blood and the Rose* tells

the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe, including current scientific research. Total running time is 95 minutes. In December of 1531, in present-day Mexico City, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a humble peasant by the name of Juan Diego, instructing him to carry a special request to the local ordinary, Bishop Zumarraga, for a church to be built in her honor. The bishop was skeptical, but with childlike trust in Our Lady, Juan persevered, and in the moment that he opened his cloak to reveal the Castilian roses that she had given him as a sign, all present, including the bishop, were the first to lay eyes on the magnificent image (right) miraculously imprinted upon it. In the years immediately following, more than 10 million people, from a culture once mired in bloody human sacrifice, converted to the Holy Catholic Church. A feature length theatrical documentary shot on location in Mexico and Spain, The Blood & The Rose offers riveting interviews with top experts in the fields of science, history and theology, exploring the mystery of St. Juan Diego's Tilma and the miraculous image that it bears. More than just a story about a distant event, The Blood & The Rose is an invitation and a calling to emulate St. Juan Diego in our own day, carrying the message of the Virgin of Guadalupe – Patroness of the Americas and Patroness of Life – into the culture in which we live. We will be back in January with the story of Brother Andre of Montreal.
